Tuesday November 3, 1914 The Ottoman Empire - now Turkey - declared war on Russia

Friday November 13, 1914



Turkey: Kotchanes - now Konak, Hakkari province

Surma Khanum (sister of Patriarch Shimun XXI Benyamin and Shimun XXI Paulos, met a Christian Assyrian woman with a 3 month old baby, the barefoot woman told her "We were just about to go to bed when a section of Turkish soldiers on their way to Djulamerk stopped in our village [Kirmi]. The men wanted to eat. They also ordered us to bring them clothing against the cold such as socks and woolen hats since they were badly equipped. We did this without flinching. While I was preparing the meal I heard a woman from the village cry and a man's voice say, 'I am your servant but do not take my wife.' At this moment my husband came in and shouted, 'Run as fast as you can and hide!' I ran towards the cradle to take my baby and I climbed as far as here. I don't know what happened to the others.")
