Russia

Fr Antoni Dziemieszkiewicz (aged 38, **UPDATE**: arrested)

Jacob Gerber (teacher, arrested and deported to Siberia, fate unknown)

Russia: Chelyabinsk

Viktor Gotovtsev (aged 52, arrested in [Moscow](#) on [November 12, 1923](#); sentenced on [May 19, 1924](#) to 8 years' imprisonment, sent to [Chelyabinsk Prison](#), held in solitary confinement; **UPDATE**: released, sent into internal exile to Narym, Tomsk region)

Russia: Gobel, Kamenka region

Jakob Lich (farmer, parish council member, arrested on counter-revolutionary charges, convicted, fate unknown)

Johannes Haberkorn (arrested on counter-revolutionary charges, sentenced to 3 years' internal exile in Siberia, fate unknown)

K K Beratz (aged 34; arrested as a counter-revolutionary, fate unknown)

Russia: Leningrad

George Gress (teacher, former seminarian, parish council president, arrested in 1928 on charges of “suspicious contacts and being a middleman in an illegal nexus of contacts with a counter-revolutionary element”; **UPDATE**: sent into internal exile to Siberia, fate unknown)

Greis (church organist, arrested, sent into internal exile to the Northern Territory, fate unknown)

Russia: Moscow

Fr Anton Gapoian (possibly arrested, held in Butyrka Prison)

Fr Nikolay Ivanovich Tsvetkov (aged 50, arrested by the Bolsheviks in [1918](#) in [Volokolamsk](#), sentenced to forced labor, cleaned toilets and operated a horse-drawn septic wagon; held in [Lefortovo Prison](#) beginning in [1923](#); **UPDATE**: released, had spent 2 years in solitary)

Russia: Nizhni Novgorod

Georgy Chesnovsky (parish council member, arrested and sentenced to 5 months' imprisonment, fate unknown)

Sofia Glazius (parish council member, arrested, sentenced to 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, fate unknown)

Russia: Orel

Stanislaw Kozaczynski (aged 59, husband of Anna Kozaczynska, arrested in [1924](#), later released; arrested in [Kiev](#) in [1927](#), charged with 'conveying disinformation to GPU agents');

sentenced to 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp on [June 11, 1928](#), commuted to 3 years' internal exile, sent to [Kem](#), later transferred to [Orel](#); **UPDATE**: granted an early release due to his health, returned to Kiev)

Russia: Pfeifer

Augustine Kizner (aged 29, teacher, former seminarian, parish council member, arrested, convicted, fate unknown)

Russia: Rohleder, Mariental district

Joseph Frank (aged 30, farmer, de-kulakized and deported, soon returned)

Russia: Simferopol

Fr Joseph Graf (aged 60, arrested in the autumn)

Russia: Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp

Fr Bronislaw Dunin-Wasowicz (aged 31, sentenced in [Ukraine](#) on [January 27, 1927](#) to 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp after having been rearrested; **UPDATE**: released, sentenced to 3 years' internal exile in Kirensk, Irkutsk oblast)

Fr Jozef Ibianski (aged 57, arrested in [Lahojnsk, Belarus](#) in [1927](#), sentenced to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; **UPDATE**: **died**, exact date and circumstances unknown)

Russia: Smolensk

Fr Iosif Dzemian (aged 41, arrested in [1928](#) in [Minsk, Belarus](#) on labor code violations, sentenced to 2 years' internal exile; **UPDATE**: released from exile in the autumn)

Ukraine: Josefheim

Fr Joseph Gottliebovich Kolsch (aged 41, arrested on 'illegal religious activity' charges, sentenced to 8 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp)

Ukraine: Kiev

Eugenia Lasznjukowa (aged 38, former nun, underground religious teacher, arrested, released after 9 months)

Stanislawa Lepesowecka (aged 41, artist, factory worker, **UPDATE**: arrested, released)

Ukraine: Kharkiv Prison

Fr Czeslaw Fedorowicz (aged 38, arrested in [Brailov, Ukraine](#) in 1926, sentenced to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; sent to [Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp](#) in April 1927, transferred to [Vinnytsia Prison](#) in early 1928 for a six month investigation, then sent to [Kharkiv Prison](#); **UPDATE**: sentenced to death, later commuted to 10 years' imprisonment, transferred to Yaroslavl Prison on September 1, 1929 for solitary confinement)

Ukraine: Kopijowka

Fr Kazimierz Krzywicki (aged 44, arrested on anti-Soviet agitation charges, sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment, sent to Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp)

Ukraine: Kumanowce, near Lityn

Fr Antoni Liniewicz (aged 54, arrested in [Krasyliv, Ukraine](#) in 1910 for objecting to an interfaith marriage because the law required the children to be raised non-Catholic, confined to a monastery; released in 1914, beaten by Cossacks in [Radyvyliv, Kremenets district](#), sent into internal exile to [Siberia](#); released in 1917, returned to [Radyvyliv](#); arrested in [Kumanowce](#) on [September 25, 1922](#) during a seizure of church valuables, later released; **UPDATE**: arrested for teaching religion to children, sentenced to one year's imprisonment, released, left for Poland)

Ukraine: Marianovka, Yekaterinoslav province

Markusz Eger (aged 51, parish council president, charged with 'non-fulfillment of the grain requisition plan', acquitted, released)
