Joseph Eberle Jr (aged 14, son of Joseph Eberle, sent with his mother into internal exile to Ust-Sysolsk, Komi ASSR after the arrest of his father, worked as a metalworker)

Russia: Kustarevo-Krasnorynovka

Barbara Kohler (sister of Fr Augustine Baumtrog, possibly convicted, fate unknown)

Russia: Leningrad

Jozefa Lipinska (aged 33, rectory housekeeper, arrested in the autumn, soon released)

Natalia Kessler (wife of George Gress, arrested, convicted, fate unknown)

Russia: lower Volga

Alois Eilsenbach (arrested, possibly convicted, fate unknown)

Russia: Luga, Mariental district

Alexander Kessler (aged 54, arrested, convicted, fate unknown)

Russia: Marks, Saratov oblast

Alexander Matveyevich German (aged 19, arrested, convicted, fate unknown)

Fr Johannes German (aged 46, arrested, possibly convicted, fate unknown)

Karl Dreier (aged 52, teacher, arrested, possibly convicted, fate unknown)

Erna Deilova (aged 35, wife of Jakov Deilov, mother, homemaker, sent on internal exile to Kazakhstan with her children, fate unknown)

Hochfelder (trade official, charged with 'actively working to recruit young parishioners from the Volga German Republic and send them abroad to convents in Austria', convicted, fate unknown)

Victor Barasov (arrested, fate unknown)

Gavriil Akimov (sheltered Fr Adam Gareis in his apartment, arrested in Spring 1930, fate unknown)

Klemens Ebel (aged 64, parish council chairman, arrested on counter-revolutionary charges, possibly convicted, fate unknown)

Alois Fogel (parish council member, arrested, sentenced to 5 years' imprisonment to a labor camp, fate unknown)

Russia: Pokrovsk

Adam Emich (aged 58, ex-Bolshevik, convert, teacher, arrested, released, possibly later convicted, fate unknown)

Alexander Hoffman (aged 30, former seminarian, bookkeeper, convicted on counter-revolutionary charges, fate unknown)

Jacob Hunger (teacher, arrested, convicted, fate unknown)

Russia: Preuss

Fr Rafael Ditrich (aged 36, arrested, possibly convicted, fate unknown)

Russia: Razboyka, Orenburg oblast

Joseph Dobler (arrested, convicted, fate unknown)

Russia: Reinhard

Robert Kessler (aged 30, seminary graduate, arrested, possibly convicted, fate unknown)

Russia: Rohleder, Mariental district

Bonifacius Dreiling (farmer, arrested on counter-revolutionary charges, convicted, fate unknown)

Franz Hoffmann (farmer, during mass arrests of Christians went into hiding, subject of a nationwide search. fate unknown)

Jacob Lederhoff (farmer, arrested on counter-revolutionary charges, convicted, fate unknown)

Joseph Frank (aged 31, farmer, de-kulakized and deported in 1929, soon returned; **UPDATE:** went into hiding during the mass arrests of Christians)

Klemens Kapp (farmer, arrested on counter-revolutionary charges, convicted, fate unknown)

Michael Heine (carter, arrested on anti-Soviet agitation charges, convicted, fate unknown)

Michael Kapp (aged 39, farmer, arrested on anti-Soviet agitation charges, convicted, fate unknown)

Stefania Hoffmann (farmer, arrested, sent into internal exile to Kazakhstan for 3 years, later extended to 6 years, fate after June 1936 unknown)

Sebastian Haal (investigated, possibly convicted, fate unknown)

Joseph Hartmann (electrical station laborer, arrested, possibly convicted, fate unknown)
Karneyev (artist, investigated, possibly convicted, fate unknown)
Konstantin Kizner (pharmacist, arrested, convicted, fate unknown)
Konstantin Lanskoj (aged 38, office worker, arrested, sent to Butyrka Prison in Moscow, became a government informant, possibly convicted, fate unknown)
Peter German (expelled from technical school in 1926 for having a 'hostile attitude toward measures taken by the Soviet regime'; **UPDATE**: arrested, had helped Fr Augustine Baumtrog, convicted, fate unknown)
Peter Hunger (student, expelled from the Saratov Institute in 1928 for a 'hostile attitude toward measures undertaken by the Soviet regime'; **UPDATE**: arrested, convicted, fate unknown)
Pia Baumtrog (aged 41, arrested, sentenced to internal exile in Kazakhstan, fate unknown)
Valentin Dulson (instructor, arrested, convicted, fate unknown)
Waleri Banciewicz (arrested, fate unknown)
Wilhelm Grinwald (arrested, possibly convicted, fate unknown)
Zygmunt Kossakowski (aged 53, engineer, arrested, convicted, fate unknown)

Fr Eduard Dittler (aged 55, arrested, possibly convicted, fate unknown)

Russia: Semenovskoye

Jakob Dizer (parish council chairman, arrested, possibly convicted, fate unknown)

Russia: Simferopol

Bishop Alexander Frison (aged 55, on [May 1, 1927](#) had been forbidden by the GPU to travel; arrested on [August 1, 1929](#), released a month later, later arrested at the end of [1929](#) on

charges of “illegal consecration as bishop and also for having aided the White Army”;
UPDATE: released after spending a year in prison)

Alexey Graf (arrested, possibly convicted, fate unknown)

Fr Joseph Graf (aged 61, arrested in the autumn of 1929; **UPDATE:** sentenced to 6 and a half years' imprisonment, sentence suspended, released)

Russia: Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp

Fr Jozef Borodziula (aged 37, arrested December 29, 1926 in Vitebsk, Belarus; sentenced in March 1927 to 3 years' imprisonment a labor camp, sent to Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp; **UPDATE:** released, sent into internal exile to Arkangelsk, Russia)

Maria Karaliunas (arrested on February 18, 1928 in Detskoye Selo, outside Leningrad, later sentenced to 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; **UPDATE:** released, sent into 3 years' internal exile to Siberia, fate after 1933 unknown)

Fr Paul Asheberg (aged 35; sentenced to 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp on January 24, 1929; **UPDATE:** transferred to Anzer Island)

Russia: Stalingrad

Freidrich German (aged 52, pastry cook, arrested on counter-revolutionary charges, convicted, fate unknown)

Kazimierz Dabkowski (aged 52, pastry cook, arrested on counter-revolutionary charges, convicted, fate unknown)

Ivan Desch (arrested, possibly convicted, fate unknown)

Russia: Suzdal Prison

Fr Johannes Deibner (aged 57, husband of Marie Panet Deibner, father of Fr Alexander Deibner and Ivan Deibner, arrested in Petrograd on November 17, 1923; sentenced in Moscow to 10 years' imprisonment on May 19, 1924; **UPDATE:** transferred to the solitary confinement block at Yaroslavl Prison)

Fr Jerzy Jurkiewicz (aged 43, arrested, sentenced to a prison camp)

Russia: Volga German ASSR

Fr Emmanuel Bader (aged 39, arrested, released)

Fr Mateusz Brynczak (aged 66, hid and nursed a wounded Red Army soldier back to health in [April 1920](#); **UPDATE**: arrested with a group of parishioners, sentenced to 3 years' internal exile)

Ukraine: Cherny Ostrov, Proskurov district

Josif Balicki (aged 46, farmer, arrested, convicted, fate unknown)

Ukraine: Kamianets-Podilskyi

Konstantyn Kwiatkowski (office worker, arrested in [August 1923](#), not convicted; **UPDATE**: arrested, possibly convicted, fate unknown)

Ukraine: Kharkiv Prison

Fr Roman Jankowski (aged 42, arrested in [Berdychiv](#) on April 10, 1927 on charges of organizing illegal border crossings; sent to [Kharkiv Prison](#) in [May 1928](#); sentenced on [September 30, 1928](#) to 9 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sentenced then reduced to 6 years' in an amnesty to commemorate the 10th anniversary of the Revolution; **UPDATE**: sent to Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp and then to Anzer Island)

Ukraine: Kherson

Stanislaw Abramowicz (office worker, parish council member, arrested, fate unknown)

Ukraine: Kiev

Elizabeth Korona OSF (aged 29, orphanage cook, arrested, charged with 'anti-Soviet agitation', released)

Jadwiga Adamowicz (aged 57, widow, accused of pro-Polish nationalism, acquitted)

Jadwiga Binko (aged 51, rectory housekeeper, arrested, convicted, fate unknown)

Richard Jasinski (aged 32, polisher, investigated for anti-Soviet activity in [1928](#), not convicted; **UPDATE**: again investigated for anti-Soviet activity, not convicted)

Semyon Krisko (aged 50, driver, investigated for petty theft, not convicted)

Ukraine: Leticzew, Khmelnytskyi district

Stanislaw Kosiarski (aged 51, farmer, sent into internal exile to Krasnoyarsk, Russia)

Ukraine: Luzern

Fr Augustine Gabel (aged 73, arrested, convicted, fate unknown)

Ukraine: Malyn, Vinnytsia oblast

Franciszek Gadamski (underground seminarian, arrested, convicted, fate unknown)

Ukraine: Marianovka, Berdyansk

Fr Peter Heut (aged 36, jailed, released)

Ukraine: Vinnytsia

Fr Boleslaw Las (aged 25, U.S. citizen, arrested on [December 1, 1927](#) during an illegal border crossing, soon released; arrested on [February 15, 1929](#), sentenced to death; **UPDATE:** death sentence commuted to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp)

Fr Piotr Andruszkiewicz (aged 82, subject to repeated arrests, lived with his sister and clandestinely said Mass, fate unknown)
