Fr Jan Ladygo (aged 61, interrogated in 1923 under suspicion of espionage, released; arrested in 1924 and tried for marrying 'a young couple who did not register with ZAGS', acquitted; **UPDATE:** arrested, sent to Kharkiv Prison)

Ukraine: Khmelnytskyi

Fr Wojciech Kobec (aged 57, brother of Fr Antoni Kobec, arrested on [September 3, 1929](#) in [Oleshkovitsy](#) on anti-Soviet charges for encouraging rosary and third-order groups;

UPDATE: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to a camp outside Arkhangelsk in Russia, later transferred to Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp, **reported to have died in a camp in the early 1930's)**

Saturday January 26, 1930

Fr Stanislaw Ganski (aged 50, brother of Stanislaw, arrested several times in [Zhmerynka](#) in [1922](#), finally sent to prison; released from prison on [October 8, 1927](#); **UPDATE:** arrested)

Ukraine: Kiev

Fr Wladyslaw Dworzecki (aged 56, sentenced to death on [September 2, 1922](#) as an 'incorrigible enemy of the Soviet regime', commuted to 2 years' imprisonment; granted early release in [September 1923](#), returned to [Kamyanets-Podilsky](#), arrested and released several more times through [1929](#); **UPDATE:** arrested, sent to Kiev, indicted on anti-Soviet and counter-revolutionary charges)

Fr Jozef Karpinski (aged 42, arrested on [October 26, 1929](#); **UPDATE**: indicted on anti-Soviet and counter-revolutionary charges)

Fr Aleksander Kuczynski (aged 68, arrested in [Novohrad-Volynskiy, Ukraine](#), in [1923](#), sent into internal exile for 3 years; released from exile in [1925](#); **UPDATE**: arrested)

Russia: Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp

Fr Franciszek Budzinski (aged 39, sentenced to 2 years' imprisonment on [February 11, 1929](#); sent to Kem in [July 1929](#), later transferred to Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp;

UPDATE: seen in Romanovo, Volynia district, although still 'on the books' at Solovetsky)
