### Friday April 10, 1931



#### Russia: Smolensk

Sr Maria Komarovskaya OP (aged 33, arrested in [Moscow](#) on [November 13, 1923](#); sentenced on [May 19, 1924](#) to 3 years' internal exile, sent to [Samarovo, Tobolsk region](#); **UPDATE**: arrested)

### Monday April 13, 1931



#### Russia: Moscow

Fr Mikhail Tsakul (age 46; arrested on [February 12, 1929](#) on espionage and counter-revolutionary charges; released on [May 3, 1929](#); **UPDATE**: arrested on counter-revolutionary charges, broke under interrogation and implicated himself and others)

### Tuesday April 14, 1931



#### Russia: Moscow

Aleksandra Kachalova (aged 50, translator, arrested on February 21, 1935; **UPDATE**: indicted on charges of 'being a member of a Catholic group of a counter-revolutionary organization associated with an illegal monastery')

Fr Peter Sergeevich Petrikov (aged 28, arrested on anti-Soviet and counter-revolutionary charges)

## Russia: Saratov

Fr Aleksey Anisimov (aged 57, bookkeeper, arrested and charged with anti-Soviet agitation)

## Russia

Fr Alexander Dornhof (aged 40, arrested in [Rohleder](#) on [March 12, 1930](#); **UPDATE**: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp)

## Russia: Butyrka Prison, Moscow

Fr Martin Fiks (aged 48, arrested in [1923](#), sentenced to 2 years' internal exile, upon his return was rearrested and sentenced to 10 years' internal exile; arrested on [December 12, 1929](#); **UPDATE**: sentenced to death, commuted to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp)

## Russia: Kamenka, lower Volga

Fr Leonard Eberle (aged 60, sentenced on [December 2, 1929](#) to 3 years' internal exile; granted early release on [June 25, 1930](#); arrested on [July 12, 1930](#); **UPDATE**: sentenced to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, never sent, soon released due to illness, **died** before the end of the year)

## Russia: Moscow

Fr Adam Bellendir (aged 42, arrested on a train in a border region near Poland; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp)

Adam Deilov (aged 41, bookkeeper, arrested on [September 7, 1930](#) on charges of "recruiting and sending young women parishioners from the Volga German Republic to convents in Austria"; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, fate unknown)

Jakob Deilov (aged 44, husband of Erna Deilova, father, cooperative manager, arrested on [January 15, 1930](#) on charges of "recruiting and sending young women parishioners from the Volga German Republic to convents in Austria"; **UPDATE**: sentenced to death, sentence commuted to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, fate unknown)

Fr Joseph Beilmann (aged 48, arrested on [January 10, 1930](#) on a train in a border region;  
**UPDATE:** sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Belbaltlag, fate unknown)

**Russia: Krasnodar**

Grigory Alagiagian (aged 30, master cheesemaker, arrested on [February 23, 1930](#) for obtaining a false passport for Fr Aloysius Kappes; **UPDATE:** sentenced to three years in a labor camp, fate unknown)

**Ukraine: Kharkiv**

Fr Aloysius Kappes (aged 46, arrested on [July 14, 1930](#) on counter-revolutionary and espionage charges stemming from his fundraising trips abroad for charity; **UPDATE:** sentenced to death, sentence commuted to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp)

**Russia: Belostok, Tomsk oblast**

Stanislaw Bach (aged 31, bookkeeper, church organist, arrested, sent to Novosibirsk, later sentenced to 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp)

**Russia: Tomsk**

Fr Julian Gronski (aged 54, arrested, later indicted on charges of “counter-revolutionary activity, espionage on behalf of Poland, hostile agitation, and hiding gold”, transferred to Lubyanka Prison in Moscow)

Fr Mateusz Brynczak (aged 67, arrested with a group of parishioners in [Belilovka, Ukraine](#) in 1930, sentenced to 3 years' internal exile; **UPDATE**: arrested)
