Thursday September 10, 1933



### Russia: Novocherkassk

Fr Peter Heut (aged 39, jailed in [Marianovka, Berdyansk, Ukraine](#) in 1930, released; arrested in [Weizendorf](#) on [January 22, 1933](#); **UPDATE**: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Belbaltlag)

### Russia: Kaluga

Fr Wincenty Ilgin (aged 47, arrested in Kharkiv, Ukraine on October 25, 1926 on a charge of 'performing religious rites without registration'; sentenced on January 7, 1927 to 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp; sent into internal exile to Arkhangelsk oblast in October 1929; **UPDATE**: transported to Butyrka Prison in Moscow, then to Lithuania in a prisoner exchanged)

### Russia: Ladeinos Pole Station camp

Fr Wincenty Dejnisi (aged 53, arrested in [Leningrad](#) on [February 5, 1928](#) on charges of 'teaching religious doctrine to young, under-age children, leading an illegal monastery and collecting funds for aiding convicted priests'; sentenced on [August 13, 1928](#) to 7 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; arrested on [Anzer Island](#) on [July 5, 1932](#) on anti-Soviet charges, said "I am ready to give my life for my Catholic convictions"; sentenced in [Leningrad](#) to one year solitary confinement on [May 27, 1933](#); **UPDATE:** transported to Butyrka Prison, Moscow)

**Russia: Visherlag labor camp, Krasnovishersk, Ural oblast**

Fr Wladyslaw Czegis (aged 45, arrested in [Leningrad](#) on [August 15, 1931](#) on anti-Soviet agitation and counter-revolutionary charges; sentenced to 10 year's imprisonment on [March 7, 1932](#); **UPDATE:** transferred to Moscow, sent to Lithuania in a prisoner exchange)

**Russia: Yaroslavl**

Fr Jan Ladygo (aged 64, interrogated in [Satanow](#) in [1923](#) under suspicion of espionage, released; arrested in [1924](#) and tried for marrying 'a young couple who did not register with ZAGS', acquitted; arrested on [January 2, 1930](#), sent to [Kharkiv Prison](#); sentenced on [June 30, 1930](#) to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp followed by 5 years' internal exile; sent in [December 1930](#) to solitary confinement at [Yaroslavl Political Isolator](#); **UPDATE:** released, sent to Lithuania in a prisoner exchange)

**Sunday September 27, 1933**



**Russia: Yaroslavl Prison**

Fr Jozef Kowalski (aged 35, secretly ordained in [Leningrad](#) on [December 4, 1928](#); arrested in [Fastiv, Ukraine](#) on [May 29, 1929](#); during interrogation in [Kiev](#) on [June 17, 1929](#) said "As a believer, I was dissatisfied with the policy of anti-religious propaganda of the Soviet regime, which forbade the opening of theological seminaries"; sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp on [June 12, 1930](#); **UPDATE:** transferred to Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp)

**Ukraine: Buchki, Malyn district, Kiev province**

Nikolay Galicki (aged 40, father of Nikolay Galicki III, farmer, arrested on charges of 'carrying out active [nationalistic] work among the Polish populace')

**Ukraine: Kiev**

Stanislawa Lepasowicka (aged 45, artist, factory worker, **UPDATE**: arrested)

Zygmunt Lepasowicki (aged 55, office worker, arrested in **Kiev** on **February 16, 1929**, and sent into 3 years' internal exile to **Siberia**; arrested in **Mariinsk, Russia** in **May 1929**; transferred to **Kiev** on **March 1, 1930**, sentenced to 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, returned to **Kiev** upon release; arrested in **April 1933**; released in **June 1933**; **UPDATE**: arrested, possibly convicted, fate unknown)
