**Monday October 9, 1933**



### **Russia: Kostroma**

Sr Raisa Krylevskaya OP (aged 37, arrested in [Moscow](#) on [January 30, 1924](#); sentenced to 3 years' internal exile on [May 19, 1924](#), sent to [Tobolsk region](#); released from exile on [May 9, 1927](#) but prohibited from returning to [Moscow](#); **UPDATE:** arrested, sent to Butyrka Prison in Moscow)

Fr Jozef Borodziula (aged 40, released from internal exile in [Arkangelsk, Russia](#) on [July 11, 1933](#); **UPDATE:** arrested)

### **Belarus: Vitebsk**

Fr Antoni Jarmolowicz (aged 36, arrested in [Minsk](#) in [1919](#) as a hostage, released after a prisoner exchange with Poland; arrested in [January 1921](#), soon released; arrested in [Nevel, Vitebsk region](#) in [1932](#); **UPDATE:** sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp)

Fr Jozef Borodziula (aged 40, arrested on [October 14, 1933](#); **UPDATE:** sentenced to 3 years' internal exile, sent to Arkangelsk, Russia)

**Russia: Anzer Island**

Fr Roman Jankowski (aged 45, arrested in [Berdychiv, Ukraine](#) on [April 10, 1927](#) on charges of organizing illegal border crossings; sent to Kharkiv Prison in [May 1928](#); sentenced on [September 30, 1928](#) to 9 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sentenced then reduced to 6 years' in an amnesty to commemorate the 10th anniversary of the Revolution; sent to [Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp](#) and then to [Anzer Island](#) in [May 1932](#); arrested on [July 5, 1932](#), charged with 'creation of an anti-Soviet group that conducted anti-Soviet agitation, clandestinely celebrated Mass and religious rites and maintained an illegal contact with a free worker for purposes of transmitting abroad information of an espionage character about the situation of Catholics in the USSR', said under interrogation "I consider myself a faithful and staunch Catholic, as I shall be until the end"; **UPDATE:** sent into internal exile to Almaty, Kazakhstan)

**Russia: Butyrka Prison, Moscow**

Fr Michal Bugienis (aged 45, sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in [August 1931](#); **UPDATE:** sent to Lithuania in a prisoner exchange)

Fr Wincenty Dejnisi (aged 53, arrested in [Leningrad](#) on [February 5, 1928](#) on charges of 'teaching religious doctrine to young, under-age children, leading an illegal monastery and collecting funds for aiding convicted priests'; sentenced on [August 13, 1928](#) to 7 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; arrested on [Anzer Island](#) on [July 5, 1932](#) on anti-Soviet charges, said "I am ready to give my life for my Catholic convictions"; sentenced in [Leningrad](#) to one year solitary confinement on [May 27, 1933](#); **UPDATE:** released, sent on a prisoner exchange to Lithuania)
