Monday November 6, 1933



Germany: Munster

Bishop Clemens August Graf von Galen (aged 55, refused to allow the addition of anti-Semitic teaching to the schools under his jurisdiction)

Tuesday November 14, 1933



Ukraine: Kiev

Stepan Deyneko (aged 51, streetcar motorman, arrested on [January 15, 1933](#) on charges of belonging to a Ukrainian military organization; sentenced to death on [May 9, 1933](#); **UPDATE**: sentence not affirmed on appeal, sentenced to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, fate unknown)

Thursday November 16, 1933



Russia: Butyrka Prison, Moscow

Sr Raisa Krylevskaya OP (aged 37, arrested in [Moscow](#) on [January 30, 1924](#); sentenced to 3 years' internal exile on [May 19, 1924](#), sent to [Tobolsk region](#); released from exile on [May 9, 1927](#) but prohibited from returning to Moscow; arrested in [Kostroma](#) on [October 9, 1933](#); **UPDATE**: another prisoner testified “Raisa Ivanovna Krylevskaya was endlessly devoted to Mother Catherine Abrikosova and Bishop [Eugene] Neveu. In her words, she would follow them 'to the firing squad'”)

Wednesday November 22, 1933



Russia: Temnikov camp

Fr Leonid Jurkiewicz (aged 54, arrested in [Brailov, Ukraine](#) on [May 26, 1929](#) despite being an invalid and suffering serious ailments; sentenced in [Kiev Prison](#) on [November 23, 1929](#) to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; sent to the [Kotlas section of Temnikov camp](#) in [December 1929](#); **UPDATE**: released due to illness, fate unknown)

Russia: Ufa

Fr Mieczyslaw Joudakas (aged 42, arrested in [December 1926](#), soon released; arrested in [April 1929](#), sent into 3 years' internal exile to the [Northern Territory](#); released in [December 1929](#); **UPDATE**: arrested, sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp)

Sunday November 26, 1933



Russia: Moscow

Fr Kazimierz Jurszan (aged 47, arrested in [1926](#), sentenced to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to [Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp](#); sent into internal exile to [Krasnoyarsk](#) on [September 22, 1930](#); sent to [Moscow](#) on [August 2, 1933](#); **UPDATE**: released, sent to Lithuania in a prisoner exchange)

November 1933, date unknown



Russia: Anzer Island

Fr Piotr Emelianov (aged 49, arrested in [Nizhne-Bogdanovka, Ukraine](#) on [January 27, 1927](#); sentenced in [Luhansk, Ukraine](#) on September 12, 1927 to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; transferred to [Anzer Island](#) in [June 1929](#), took care of the mortally ill Fr Felix Lubczynski; arrested on [July 5, 1932](#), charged with 'creation of an anti-Soviet group that conducted anti-Soviet agitation, clandestinely celebrated Mass and religious rites and maintained an illegal contact with a free worker for purposes of transmitting abroad information of an espionage character about the situation of Catholics in the USSR', under interrogation said "Here I have become stronger and nothing can shake my faith"; **UPDATE:** transferred to Nadvoitsy Station in Belbaltlag labor camp, and later to Medvezhia Gora Station on the Kirov Railroad)

Russia: Yaroslavl prison

Fr Antoni Kobec (aged 53, brother of Fr Wojciech Kobec, arrested in [Kupil, Ukraine](#) on [November 9, 1929](#); sentenced in [Kiev](#) on [May 10, 1930](#) to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; sent to the [Yaroslavl Political Isolator](#) on [May 25, 1930](#); **UPDATE:** transferred to Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp, later released, settled in Armavir, Krasnodar region, worked as a factory guard)
