

Today's Martyrs – December 1933

Friday December 8, 1933



Russia: Butyrka Prison, Moscow

Sr Raisa Krylevskaya OP (aged 37, arrested on [January 30, 1924](#); sentenced to 3 years' internal exile on [May 19, 1924](#), sent to [Tobolsk region](#); released from exile on [May 9, 1927](#) but prohibited from returning to [Moscow](#); arrested in [Kostroma](#) on [October 9, 1933](#); another prisoner testified on [November 16, 1933](#) "Raisa Ivanovna Krylevskaya was endlessly devoted to Mother Catherine Abrikosova and Bishop [Eugene] Neveu. In her words, she would follow them 'to the firing squad'"; **UPDATE:** under interrogation said "I have expressed counter-revolutionary views, directed against the policies of the Party and Soviet authority. I stand by my counter-revolutionary views even now. I have not changed them and do not choose to do so. I am a fundamental opponent of the policy being carried out by Soviet power both in the city and in the countryside")

Marie Panet Deibner (wife of Fr Johannes Deibner, mother of Fr Alexander and Ivan Deibner, arrested on counter-revolutionary charges)

Russia: Pirovsk, eastern Siberia

Fr Bronislaw Dunin-Wasowicz (aged 35, sentenced in [Ukraine](#) on [January 27, 1927](#) to 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp after having been rearrested; released, sentenced to 3 years' internal exile in [Kirensk, Irkutsk oblast](#) in [1929](#); arrested in [March 1931](#); transferred in [June 1931](#) to solitary confinement in [Irkutsk](#); transferred to [Krasnoyarsk Prison](#) on [February 1, 1932](#) despite his sentence being completed; released from prison on [July 6, 1933](#), sentenced to internal exile; **UPDATE**: released from internal exile but denied travel documents)

Russia: Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp

Fr Jozef Krummel (aged 61, arrested in [Starokostyantyniv, Ukraine](#) on [December 19, 1929](#); sentenced to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp on [June 27, 1930](#); transferred from [Yaroslavl Prison in Russia](#) to [Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp](#) in [May 1933](#); **UPDATE**: sent into internal exile to Aktobe oblast, Kazakhstan)

Russia: Tambov

Fr Mikhail Tsakul (age 48; arrested on [April 13, 1931](#) on counter-revolutionary charges, broke under interrogation and implicated himself and others; sentenced on [November 18, 1931](#) to internal exile; **UPDATE**: allowed to return to Moscow, resumed his ministry)
