Ukraine: Popovtsy, Vinnytsia province

Marian Goliszewski (aged 37, church organist, arrested on counter-revolutionary charges)

Russia: Kazachinsk, Krasnoyarsk oblast

Fr Mateusz Brynczak (aged 71, arrested with a group of parishioners in [Belilovka, Ukraine](#) in 1930, sentenced to 3 years' internal exile; arrested in [Tomsk](#) on [April 25, 1931](#); released in [March 1932](#) for lack of evidence; arrested in [Tomsk](#) on [February 9, 1933](#) on espionage and 'religious propaganda' charges, admitted he had performed baptisms; sentenced on [June 27, 1933](#) to 3 years' internal exile to Eastern Siberia; **UPDATE**: released from internal exile, allowed to return to Tomsk)

Germany: Dickenschied

Pastor Paul Schneider (aged 37, husband of Margarete Dieterich, father of six, arrested in [June 1934](#) after telling a Hitler Youth leader that he would not allow God's Word to be adulterated during a funeral service for a Hitler Youth boy, released after a week; **UPDATE**: arrested without warrant after reading a Confessing Church synod document that criticized the government, released after a few days, later interrogated a dozen times in the winter of 1935-36)
