Aleksandra Astreijko (aged 64, widow, unemployed, arrested on [February 21, 1935](#); **UPDATE**: sentenced to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, fate unknown)

Nina Kenarskaya (aged 37, bookkeeper, arrested on [February 21, 1935](#); indicted on [April 14, 1935](#) on charges of 'being a member of a Catholic group of a counter-revolutionary organization associated with an illegal monastery, attending the French church, and carrying out assignments for [Bishop] Neveu'; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, fate unknown)

Tamara Barykova (aged 21, agricultural student, arrested on [February 21, 1935](#); **UPDATE**: sentenced to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, fate unknown)

Fr Joseph Krushinski (aged 70, arrested in [Karlsruhe, near Odessa, Ukraine](#), in [1932](#), sent into 3 years' internal exile; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp)

Russia: Leningrad

Fr Igor Akulov (aged 38, released from prison in Irkutsk and into internal exile in Siberia in 1927; released from exile on May 22, 1933; **UPDATE:** arrested, released)

Ippolit Balicki (aged 29, factory mechanic, **UPDATE:** arrested, sentenced to a labor camp, fate unknown)

Lev Bujnowski (aged 26, church organist and choir member, arrested on June 21, 1930, charged with 'leadership of an illegal Polish national-chauvinistic Catholic youth organization'; banished for 3 years on November 21, 1930; **UPDATE:** allowed to return to Leningrad, arrested, sentenced to possibly 10 years imprisonment in a labor camp, fate unknown)

Sofia Kliamko (aged 23, post office accountant, arrested in April 1932; released in June 1932 for lack of evidence; **UPDATE:** arrested, placed in a psychiatric hospital, fate unknown)
