Archpriest Christopher Varfolomeev (aged 55, arrested in Leningrad on January 17, 1934 on counter-revolutionary charges, refused to testify, later sentenced to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; **UPDATE**: died in a camp hospital)

Elena Czernecka (aged 44, arrested on counter-revolutionary charges on March 8, 1938, had been fundraising for church repairs; **UPDATE**: convicted, sentenced to 8 years' imprisonment in a labor camp)

#### Austria

The von Trapp family fled the country due to the indoctrination of children against Jews, in favor of spying on their parents and in favor of abortion

Georg von Trapp (aged 58, father, dual Italian citizen, refused a commission in the German navy)

Maria Augusta von Trapp (aged 33, stepmother, counseled by her doctor that she could procure an abortion)

Agathe von Trapp (aged 25)

Eleonore von Trapp (aged 7)

Hedwig von Trapp (aged 21)

Johanna von Trapp (aged 19)

Maria von Trapp (aged 23)

Martina von Trapp (aged 17)

Rosemarie von Trapp (aged 9 or 10)

Rupert von Trapp (aged 27, medical student, refused a position because it would have discharged a Jewish physician)

Werner von Trapp (aged 22)

#### Germany

Hans Philipp Ehrenberg (theologian, husband of Else Zimmerman Ehrenberg, published *Seventy-Two Theses to the Jewish-Christian Question* in July 1933, which opposed anti-Semitism; **UPDATE**: barred from delivering homilies)
