Marian Galisziewski (aged 40, arrested in Vinnytsia oblast in December 1934; sentenced to 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp on April 23, 1935; **UPDATE**: sentenced to death and shot dead)

Frants Brodovsky (aged 37, church organist, arrested in Stavishche, Tarashcha district, Kiev province on May 20, 1938, later sentenced to death; **UPDATE**: shot dead)

Sunday October 9, 1938



Russia

Anna Brilliantova (aged 29, biology student, arrested in Moscow on July 27, 1933 on false charges of plotting to kill Stalin; sentenced on February 19, 1934 to 8 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp where she married Kerim Kaziyev and gave birth to Teimur Kaziyev on April 19, 1936; sent to prison in 1937; **UPDATE:** sentenced to death)

Germany: Sontheim

Church service disrupted by Nazis, worshippers were threatened with being pelted with pieces of wood during their arrival

Pastor Theophil Brendle (aged 40, church bulletin banned by the Nazis for six months in 1935 in Vaihingen an der Enz after writing criticism of their control of and interference in the churches and quoting Galatians "...false brethren unawares brought in, who came in privily to spy out our liberty which we have in Christ Jesus, that they might bring us into bondage"; UPDATE: homily drowned out by Brown Shirts and others who had surrounded his church and blew horns and sang Nazi songs)

Georg Ziefle (aged 37, husband of Maria Ziefle, father of Reinhold, Ruth, and Kurt, sewing machine salesman, attempted to confront the Nazis but was restrained by his wife)

Maria Ziefle (aged 39, wife of Georg Ziefle, mother of Reinhold, Ruth, and Kurt, expectant mother of Helmut, sister of Wilhelm Glaser, homemaker)

Reinhold Ziefle (aged 13, son of Georg and Maria Ziefle, attended church rather than attend a Hitler Youth meeting with his brother Kurt)

Ruth Ziefle (aged 10, daughter of Georg and Maria Ziefle)

Austria: Vienna

Cardinal Theodor Innitzer (aged 63, reported to have said in an October 24, 1938 homily to youth "in the last few months you have lost everything!" and "There is just one Fuhrer: Jesus Christ"; **UPDATE**: a Nazi mob including older Hitler Youth invaded the cathedral grounds and ransacked his residence)

Ukraine: Kiev

Eugenia Lasznjukowa (aged 47, former nun, underground religious teacher, arrested in 1929, released after 9 months; arrested on July 9, 1938; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, fate unknown)

Germany: Gransee

Fr Albert Willimsky (arrested by the Gestapo for anti-Nazi remarks)

Germany: Sontheim

Wilhelm Glaser (husband of Paula Glaser, brother of Maria Ziefle, arrested by the Gestapo in late October 1938 for saying "Hitler is a scoundrel" at his place of employment, committed to a hospital for the insane)

Paula Glaser (wife of Wilhelm Glaser, told by her husband's foreman after his arrest "Everyone must be sacrificed for the Party")

Georg Ziefle (aged 37, husband of Maria Ziefle, brother-in-law of Wilhelm Glaser, attempted to confront the Nazis during their October 9, 1938 assault on his church but was restrained by his wife; **UPDATE**: said to Maria when he heard the news of Wilhelm Glaser's arrest "Animals! Germany is being governed by animals!")
