Russia: Leningrad

Fr Pawel Chomicz (aged 47, arrested in Leningrad on December 3, 1926, charged with counter-revolutionary activities; released from camp on November 10, 1936, sent into internal exile to Kostroma; returned to Leningrad in August 1939 and lived underground, performed a large number of pastoral duties; arrested on July 15, 1941, charged with operating an underground church and slander of the Soviet state; **UPDATE**: sentenced to death)

Russia: Unzhlag labor camp, Komi ASSR

Fr Franciszek Janocha OFM (aged 29, arrested in Lviv by the Soviets in July 1940, sentenced to death, commuted to imprisonment in a labor camp; **UPDATE**: amnestied as a Polish citizen)

Uzbekistan: Samarkand

Fr Robert Glassner (aged 56, arrested in Dehler, Saratov province, Russia on February 2, 1930 on counter-revolutionary charges; sentenced on June 6, 1931 in Yaroslavl Prison to 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; released from Karlag in 1934, sent into internal exile; arrested on July 5, 1941 on anti-Soviet agitation charges; sentenced to death on August 8, 1941; **UPDATE**: shot dead)

Russia: Leningrad

Fr Pawel Chomicz (aged 47, arrested on July 15, 1941, charged with operating an underground church and slander of the Soviet state; sentenced to death on September 1, 1941; **UPDATE**: shot dead)

Thursday September 11, 1941



Russia: Vorkutlag labor camp

Fr Antoni Guzik SDB (aged 49, arrested in Lviv, Poland on April 24, 1940 for 'anti-Soviet agitation'; sentenced on May 7, 1941 to 8 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; **UPDATE**: amnestied as a Polish citizen, became a chaplain in the Polish Armed Forces of the East, later left the USSR when he came under British command)

Germany: Dachau Concentration Camp

Fr Korbinian Aigner (aged 56, arrested in Hohenbercha on November 22, 1939 for a homily on "Thou shalt not kill" in which he said the recent failed assassination of Hitler might have saved a million people, sent to Freising prison; sentenced on May 7, 1940 to seven months' imprisonment; sent to Dachau on June 23, 1941; **UPDATE**: transferred to Sachsenhausen)

Fr Joseph Benedict Stoffels SCJ (aged 46, Luxembourgian citizen, arrested by the Gestapo in Paris, France on March 7, 1941 for aiding refugees, sent to Buchenwald; **UPDATE**: transferred to Dachau concentration camp)

Fr Nicholas Anthony Wampach SCJ (aged 31, Luxembourgian citizen, arrested by the Gestapo in Paris, France on March 7, 1941 for aiding refugees, sent to Buchenwald; **UPDATE**: transferred to Dachau concentration camp)

Sofia Krasovskaya (aged 49, secondary school teacher, arrested in Kiev, Ukraine on March 23, 1939 for 'assisting a fugitive priest [Fr Andronik Rudenko] and anti-Soviet agitation'; sentenced to 2 years' imprisonment in a labor camp on September 25, 1939; UPDATE: released, returned to Bila Tserkva, Ukraine, fate unknown)
