Fr Peter Heut (aged 48, jailed in Marianovka, Berdyansk, Ukraine in 1930, released; arrested in Weizendorf on January 22, 1933; sentenced on September 10, 1933 to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Belbaltlag; transferred to Kargopol camp on July 6, 1941; UPDATE: died)

Archimandrite Grigol Peradze (aged 43, went into exile after the Communist occupation of Georgia on February 25, 1921; **UPDATE:** arrested by the Gestapo for activities in sympathy with Christians and Jews)

Fr Pirro Scavizzi (Italian military chaplain, while travelling with his unit in Poland and Russia at the end of February 1942 began to compile a report of concentration camps where tens of thousands disappeared, included reports of the smoke from the crematorium at Auschwitz; **UPDATE**: presented his report to Pope Pius XII, said later that the pope upon receiving the news raised his hands to heaven and "wept like a child")

Those who are Gypsies, Black, European, or Aryan all have the same rights...for this reason, the Catholic Church had always condemned, and continues to condemn, all injustice and all violence committed in the name of theories of class, race, or nationality. It is not permissible to persecute Gypsies or Jews because they are thought to be an inferior race")
