Fr Jozef Kowalski (aged 31, arrested by the Gestapo in [Krakow](#) on [May 23, 1941](#) and tortured; sent to [Auschwitz](#) on [June 26, 1941](#); **UPDATE: beaten to death** for being a priest)

Fr Vladislaw Adamski (aged 53, Polish citizen arrested on [August 26, 1940](#) in [Ludzisko, Poland](#), sent to Szczeglin transit camp; transferred on [August 29, 1940](#) to Sachsenhausen concentration camp; transferred on [December 14, 1940](#) to Dachau; **UPDATE: died**)

Poland: Auschwitz Concentration Camp

Br Stanislaw Antoni Trojanowski OFM Conv (aged 33, arrested in [Niepokalanow monastery, Teresin](#) on [October 14, 1941](#); transferred from [Pawiak Prison in Warsaw](#) to Auschwitz on [January 8, 1942](#); **UPDATE: died from pneumonia**)

Saturday July 11, 1942



Netherlands: Utrecht

Archbishop Johannes de Jong (aged 56, sent a telegram to the German occupational authority that read "The undersigned Dutch churches, already deeply shocked by the actions taken against the Jews in the Netherlands that have excluded them from participating in the normal life of society, have learned with horror of the new measures by which men, women, children, and whole families will be deported to the German territory and its dependencies...The suffering that this measure will bring upon tens of thousands of people, the knowledge that these measures are contrary to the deepest moral sense of the Dutch people, and, above all, the hostility of these measures against the divine norms of justice and mercy urge the churches to direct to you the urgent petition not to execute these measures...")

Anna Ignatowicz (aged 53, arrested on anti-Soviet charges including 'organizing an underground church, where secret worship services were held')

Jadwiga Kazakowa (arrested on anti-Soviet charges including 'organizing an underground church, where secret worship services were held')

Maria Koszko OSF (aged 65, arrested in [January 1927](#), soon released; **UPDATE**: arrested on anti-Soviet charges including "organizing an underground church, where secret worship services were held')

Poland – now Belarus: Baranovichi

Fr Leon Bujnowski (aged 51, went into hiding in Gormel, Belarus in 1922 after being accused of 'opposing the seizure of church valuables', arrested, convicted; sent to Poland in a prisoner exchange in 1924; arrested by the Germans in [Niedźwiedzice, Poland](#) on [June 27, 1942](#); **UPDATE**: **shot dead** by the Germans along with 14 other priests)

Friday July 17, 1942



Russia: Leningrad

Klementina Kalygina OSF (aged 54, milliner, arrested on [November 26, 1929](#); sentenced on [September 8, 1930](#) to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, later sent into internal exile and then returned illegally to [Leningrad](#) to pursue active ministry; **UPDATE**: arrested,

charged with 'organizing an underground church where secret worship services were held and damaging, anti-Soviet agitation was conducted')

Poland: Katowice

Fr Jan Macha (aged 46, interrogated by the Gestapo on [June 1, 1940](#), released; arrested on [September 6, 1941](#), tortured; **UPDATE:** sentenced to death)

Fr Alojzy Prabucki (aged 46, Polish citizen, brother of Fr Pawel Prabucki and Fr Boleslaw Prabucki, arrested in [Gronowo, Poland](#) in the [autumn of 1939](#), sent to [Sachsenhausen](#); transferred to [Dachau](#) on [December 14, 1940](#); **UPDATE:** [died](#))

Fr Titus Brandsma O.Carm (arrested in [the Netherlands](#) on [January 19, 1942](#) while delivering a letter from his bishops to the editors of Catholic newspapers; arrived at [Dachau](#) on [June 19, 1942](#); **UPDATE:** [killed with a lethal injection](#))

Netherlands: Utrecht

Archbishop Johannes de Jong (aged 56, sent a telegram on [July 11, 1942](#) to the German occupational authority that read "The undersigned Dutch churches, already deeply shocked by the actions taken against the Jews in the Netherlands that have excluded them from participating in the normal life of society, have learned with horror of the new measures by which men, women, children, and whole families will be deported to the German territory and its dependencies...The suffering that this measure will bring upon tens of thousands of people, the knowledge that these measures are contrary to the deepest moral sense of the Dutch people, and, above all, the hostility of these measures against the divine norms of justice and mercy urge the churches to direct to you the urgent petition not to execute these measures..."; **UPDATE:** issued a pastoral letter which read "We live in a time of great affliction, both spiritual and material. In recent times two specific afflictions have come to the fore: the persecution of the Jews and the unfortunate lot of those who are sent to work in foreign countries... These afflictions must also be brought to the attention of those who are responsible for them. To this end, the venerable Dutch Episcopate, in communion with nearly all the churches in the Netherlands, approached the authorities of the occupying forces concerning, among other things, the Jews, in a recent telegram of Saturday, July 11. The telegram stated the following...Beloved faithful, when we consider the immense spiritual and physical misery that, for three years already, has threatened the entire world with destruction, then we think naturally of the situation that the Gospel of today [Luke 19: 41-44] paints for us...Now, too, everything around us points to a punishment from God...Beloved faithful, let us first examine ourselves with a deep sense of repentance and humility. Are we not, after all, partly responsible for the disasters that affect us? Have we always fulfilled the duties of justice and charity toward our neighbor?...Therefore, beloved faithful, let us implore God, through the intercession of the Mother of Mercy, that He will soon grant the world a just peace. May He sustain the people of Israel, who are being so bitterly tested in these days, and may He bring them to true redemption in Jesus Christ. May He protect those whose lot it is to work in foreign lands and to be separated from their loved ones. May He protect them in soul and body, protect them from becoming bitter and discouraged, keep them faithful to the Christian faith, and may God also strengthen those they left behind...", the Nazis retaliated by arresting over 40,000 Catholics of Jewish descent, this retaliation caused the Vatican to cancel a planned protest of Nazi atrocities)
