Wednesday January 13, 1943



USSR

Fr Jan Kapusta SDB (aged 49, arrested in Dzyatlava, Poland [now Belarus] in 1940, sent to a prison camp; amnestied as a Polish citizen in February 1942; arrested on August 10, 1942 as the Polish Armed Forces of the East was exiting the USSR into Iran; UPDATE: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Vorkutlag in Russia)

Wednesday January 20, 1943



Russia: Sevvostoklag labor camp, Magadan oblast

Fr Teobald Kopp (aged 51, arrested in Strassburg, Ukraine on June 6, 1935; sentenced on October 8, 1935 to 8 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; sentence completed, detained in the camp on April 29, 1942 until the end of the war; **UPDATE**: died)

Friday January 22, 1943



Poland - now Belarus: Janow Poleski

Fr Witold Iwicki (aged 59, arrested in Petrograd on September 20, 1920 on counter-revolutionary and espionage charges; sentenced on October 14, 1920 to confinement in a prison camp until the end of the Civil War; released in early 1921 due to illness, sent to Poland in a prisoner exchange; **UPDATE**: shot dead by the Gestapo, had aided Jews and others)

Saturday January 30, 1943



Germany: Dachau Concentration Camp

Auxiliary Bishop Michal Kozal (aged 49, Polish citizen, arrested along with 44 priests and seminarians in Poland on November 7, 1939, tortured; **UPDATE**: killed with a lethal injection after contracting typhus)

January 1943, date unknown



Poland - now Ukraine: Volodymyr-Volynsky

Fr Stanislaw Kobylecki (aged 40, arrested by the Soviets in Volodymyr-Volynsky in 1940; escaped from Lutsk prison during the June 1941 execution of prisoners by the Soviet Army; arrested by the German Gestapo in Volodymyr-Volynsky in October 1942; UPDATE: released)

Croatia: Jasenovac concentration camp, Slovania

Vukasin Klepacki (aged 50-60, ordered by a camp guard to give homage to Croatian dictator Ante Pavelic, remained silent, in response was hacked to death, during the attack called his killer "My child")

Fr Pierre Cesar SJ (published religious articles denouncing Nazi anti-Semitism; **UPDATE**: arrested by the Gestapo, later released thanks to false papers, helped Jews escape to Spain and Switzerland)
