Fr Nicholas Bunkerd Kitbamrung (aged 49, arrested on January 12, 1941 on espionage and 'rebellion against the kingdom' charges, sentenced to 15 years' imprisonment; **UPDATE**: died in prison of tuberculosis, had baptized at least 66 people in prison)

Fr Carl Lampert (aged 50, arrested in Innsbruck, Austria on August 25, 1940 and sent to Dachau for publishing an obituary on the death of Fr Otto Neuruer; sent to Sachsenhausen on September 1, 1940; sent to Dachau on December 15, 1940; freed on August 1, 1941; arrested in Stettin on February 4, 1943, tortured; **UPDATE:** sent to Torgau)

Saturday January 15, 1944



France: Avon, Seine-et-Marne

Fr Lucien Louis Bunel OCD (aged 43, arrested along with three Jewish students he had been harboring at his boarding school, sent to Mauthansen-Gusen Concentration Camp, later managed to stay at Mauthansen despite the harsher conditions there and minister to his fellow prisoners when all other priest inmates were sent to Dachau)

Germany: Berlin

Helmut James Graf von Moltke (aged 36, husband of Freya von Moltke, international jurist, wrote in 1942 "Today, not a numerous, but an active part of the German people are beginning to realize, not that they have been led astray, not that bad times await them, not that the war may end in defeat, but that what is happening is sin and that they are personally responsible for each terrible deed that has been committed - naturally, not in the earthly sense, but as Christians"; **UPDATE**: arrested by the Gestapo for warning a friend he was about to be arrested)
