USSR

Auxiliary Bishop Kazimir Dulbinskis (aged 58, arrested in 1949 in Riga, Latvia, sent to Ukhtizhlag labor camp, later sent into internal exile; **UPDATE**: allowed to return to Latvia, not allowed to resume his ministry)

Russia: Ukhtizhlag labor camp, Sosnovka, Komi ASSR

Fr Bronislaw Drzepecki (aged 58, arrested by the Soviets in Zhytomyr, Ukraine on January 10, 1945; sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp on March 6, 1946; released from camp on November 10, 1954, kept in internal exile; arrested in Akmolinsk oblast, Kazakstan in 1956 on anti-Soviet activities related to his secret Masses, sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; **UPDATE**: released, returned to active ministry)

Romania

Archimandrite Mina Dobzeu (aged 42, imprisoned in 1948 for 11 months and then subjected to 5 years' house arrest for protesting the seizure of icons, churches, and monasteries; arrested after the dismantling of the monasteries, tried in a military court, and sent in February 1959 to prison and then to a Danube canal labor camp; **UPDATE**: released)

Auxiliary Bishop Basil Hopko (aged 60, arrested in [Presov, Slovakia](#) on [April 28, 1950](#) along with Bishop Pavel Peter Gojdic for refusing to merge his church into the Russian Orthodox Church, starved and tortured; **UPDATE**: released from prison due to ill health and sent to a nursing home)
