Russia: Moscow

Peter Pavolvich Vashchenko (husband of Augustina Vasilovna Vashchenko, detained on [May 29, 1968](#) for attempting to enter the U.S. Embassy; **UPDATE**: released, told that he would be tried as a traitor should he enter any embassy again for more than three hours, ordered to leave Moscow immediately and falsely told his four detained daughters had been sent home)

Boris Vladimirovich Talantov (aged 65, widower of Nina Agafangelovna Talantova, signed an open letter on [March 30, 1968](#) which criticized the Moscow Patriarchate for its cooperation with the Soviet regime; **UPDATE**: arrested)

Tuesday June 18, 1968



Russia: Moscow

Peter Pavolvich Vashchenko (husband of Augustina Vasilovna Vashchenko, detained on [May 29, 1968](#) for attempting to enter the U.S. Embassy; released on [June 6, 1968](#), told that he would be tried as a traitor should he enter any embassy again for more than three hours,

ordered to leave Moscow immediately and falsely told his four detained daughters had been sent home; **UPDATE**: returned to Moscow after finding his four daughters were still missing, managed to get into the U.S. Embassy and spoke with the Ambassador concerning emigration, arrested upon leaving, initially placed in a psychiatric hospital, later sentenced to one year in a strict regime labor camp)

Augustina Vasilovna Vashchenko (wife of Peter Pavolvich Vashchenko, **UPDATE**: detained while attempting to enter the U.S. Embassy, beaten)

Natasha Vashchenko (aged 54, sister of Peter Pavolvich Vashchenko, detained while attempting to enter the U.S. Embassy)
