Imad Gad (former Member of Parliament and political analyst, **UPDATE**: opinion column dropped from Al-Watan newspaper after he wrote "...In our country, where poverty, ignorance, disease and superstition are rampant, it is quite different [than Europe]. We have a vague constitution, confused about the relationship of religion to the state. At the same time, we have laws with ambiguous clauses that intentionally enter the subject in a maze and do not resolve the situation on specific issues. The church building law, which was issued a year ago to arrange the process of building and reforming churches, finds that the approval of the building or the reform 'after reference to the authorities concerned' and it is no secret that the concerned parties concerned the security authorities, The National Security Apparatus, which continues to work according to the principles laid down by the President of the Faithful and within which the Agency works with all its might to deepen the wounds of the Christians in the country and prevent the march towards building a state of citizenship")

Pastor Andrew Brunson (U.S. citizen, husband of Norine Brunson, detained as a 'national security risk' in **Izmir** on **October 7, 2016**, denied access to U.S. diplomats, attorneys, and fellow parishioners; ordered held on **December 9, 2016** on 'terrorism' allegations from a 'secret informant', attorney denied access to the allegations; as of **August 25, 2017** four new charges have been added by prosecutors including 'gathering state secrets for espionage, attempting to overthrow the Turkish parliament and government, and to change the constitutional order'; confirmed to be a hostage at a **September 28, 2017** press conference by President Recep Tayyip Erdogan, the President explicitly called for the U.S. government to exchange him for Sufi cleric and U.S. resident Fethullah Gulen;
UPDATE: sent a letter to his wife and supporters: "I am deeply grateful to all who have prayed for me. This trial – time in prison – has stretched me far more than I ever would have imagined. I have been very weak, had many doubts, felt very alone. I know that God's grace is sustaining me, even when I do not feel that grace, and I know that the prayers of God's people are surrounding me and giving strength. One of my big fears has been that I will be forgotten in prison. Thank you for not forgetting! It is a great encouragement to know there are people praying for me – it reminds me that I am not alone, and that I need to stand firm, with my face pointed in God's direction always.

Thank you for standing with me in this most difficult time. Many blessings to you.

We still do hope that the security agencies would do much more than is being done now to ensure that the sisters are released")

Nigeria: Gidan Kuran village, Kano state

Amina Isa (aged 40, mother of five, separated from her husband after he converted to Islam in 2012 to gain employment, arrested in [May 2017](#) along with her 21 year old daughter after they were accused by her husband of abduction after she enrolled her younger children in a Christian school, released on bail; **UPDATE**: daughters aged 6 and 15 were reported to have been abducted and pressured to convert, said "Because of their refusal to convert too, we have been threatened, beaten, and subjected to all forms of indignities by my husband and his Muslim collaborators...They've constantly been threatened, beaten, and harassed. In fact, at one time, [the oldest daughter, whose name is being withheld for security reasons,] had to take her younger siblings and go into hiding, but both have been traced and captured by the officials and are currently being held against their will in a location undisclosed to me...Right now, my daughters are in the custody of these Muslim officials and are being forced into Islam, while at the same time, we are being tried on

false charges. All this is to force us to recant. We can never stop being Christians, and we are confident that the God we serve can never abandon us in our trying moments")

Rev Ayuba Hassan (Christian Association of Nigeria, **UPDATE:** reported to have said "We've been able to accompany her [Amina Isa] to the court a number of times. We pray that she'll be able to get justice from the court")

Auxiliary Bishop Theodore Mascarenhas SFX (**UPDATE:** commented after 900 radical Hindu ABVP students attempted to invade a Catholic college and consecrate it to a Hindu deity: “The Madhya Pradesh police assured church authorities full police protection. The priests who manage the College, however feel that the situation is potentially very dangerous as over 900 activists were expected to gather in violation of police orders. There was already an aggression earlier on 30 December [2017] despite the presence of 20 policemen. We need to pray more...Calm has returned to the place now as only policemen on watch have remained in the area. We thank once again the Union Home Minister Rajnath Singhji and the Madhya Pradesh police force. And a big thank you for your prayers. The Fathers and Sisters and other personnel are in a state of shock. Do continue to pray for them”)

Aleeza Ashraf (aged 18 months, daughter of Ashraf Masih and Shamim Bibi, injured with shrapnel in her abdomen and left foot during the [December 17, 2017 Quetta, Balochistan church attack](#); **UPDATE**: developed multiple gangrene infections, left foot amputated, transferred to a hospital in Karachi, in danger of death)

Shamim Bibi (mother of Aleeza Ashra and Rimla Ashraf, injured with shrapnel in the abdomen during the [December 17, 2017 Quetta, Balochistan church attack](#), hospitalized; **UPDATE**: still hospitalized, unable to travel to care for Aleeza Ashraf, said "Aleeza is innocent, she has done no wrong. She does not have the ability to speak or to cause anyone any harm. At such a young and vulnerable age she has lost her right foot and has suffered pain that no child should have to go through. Aleza was born healthy and in a loving family and we will support her whatever condition she ends up in. However at the moment unless she survives through this terrible time we may not see her alive for much longer. Please pray for her and ask our great God to save her life")

Rimla Ashraf (aged 18, sister of Aleeza Ashraf, travelled to Karachi with her sister to care for her in the hospital)

Kenya: Ijara

Esther Boniface (teacher, said “This is the second Sunday we are remaining indoors and worshipping from our homes. The churches are closed and nobody is allowed to gather in any public place. The tension is even too high for non-locals who live in rented houses. These houses have been a target for al-Shabaab because most of the non-locals who have come here to work are Christians...Many schools have also closed down with others merging and having police officers guarding day and night to make sure that nobody plants improved explosive devices [IEDs] in the school compound or inside classes”)

Pastor John (alias, said “Christians are a minority group here and the head of security has warned us of meeting in churches. There are escalating fears that the Somali terror group is planning to attack churches in Ijara, after the recent raiding of police stations. We have been avoiding our church premise for two weeks now for fear of being attacked and this is a big discouragement to us”)

Tanzania: Zanzibar Town

Pastor Charles Madama (church building demolished by a bulldozer sent by the local government, personal items including musical instruments destroyed, said “It came to us as a big surprise when the bulldozer pulled down the church building without prior notice, and we lost everything. This is a calculated move here in Zanzibar of total disregard and disrespect to Christianity. It has been extremely difficult for us as a church to assemble for worship...We lack money to appeal our case in court. But we know that church cases in Zanzibar have been thrown out, and we are very sure that even if we go to court, it will be dragged for many years, and in the end we might not get justice...At the moment it is a very difficult time for the church leadership in keeping the church members intact. We do request prayers at this trying moment, so that God may give us a place to worship. We are like orphaned children”)

Ukraine: Monastery of the Kiev Caves

Metropolitan Pavel Lebed (monastery abbot, monastery disrupted by 30 nationalists with fireworks, met with the nationalists at the gate, joined by seminarians who sang Christmas songs, the nationalists left, later said "The young men came in balaclavas and masks, with video cameras and political posters, in order to provoke disorder and fights, hoping for a violent response. But I came out to them and they apparently didn't expect this, supposing that the monks are scared by their aggressive actions. I came up to them and invited them to come to church and pray on that holy Christmas day. Of course they refused, although several of them were taken aback")

Nigeria: Karu, Nasarawa state

Nabila Umar Sanda (aged 19, convert from Islam, university student, arrested for her conversion, whereabouts unknown)

Simput Dafup (aged 33, son of Lydia, arrested for helping Nabila Umar Sanda leave Islam, whereabouts unknown)

Jeremiah Datim (church leader, helped Nabila Umar Sanda after her conversion, said "Knowing the sensitive nature of conversion from Islam to Christianity...there is a working

understanding, or protocol, that where such issues or situations arise”, after following the protocol DSSS detectives “stormed my house, assaulted my wife, daughter and eight-month-old baby, and took Nabila away”)

Lydia (mother of Simput Dafup, later said: “The men who stormed my son’s premises, heavily armed, in five Hilux vehicles, blocked everywhere and assaulted even passers-by. It has become so worrisome for me to let you know about this, because, as I speak with you now, I don’t know where my son is. Nobody has contacted me or any member of the family as to his whereabouts...I however know as a fact that some of the people that were found in the premises of his house, and who were also assaulted and brutalized along with my son, were taken to the Plateau State Command of the DSS in Jos. But these people said they did not see my son there. The DSS men who whisked my son away put a mask on him and the others they took with him...As a mother and a widow, I am worried about the safety of my son”)

Bishop Matthew Hassah Kukah (**UPDATE**: decried in a homily the “cries of shrill Islamization across the land...These cries arise when those in power use religious affiliation and blatant nepotism as means of access to power”)

China: Linfen, Shanxi province

Yang Rongli (sister of Pastor Yang Xuan, arrested on [September 24, 2009](#) while guarding her church construction site, later sentenced to 7 years' imprisonment and fined US\$4,392; released from prison in [2016](#), placed under police surveillance; **UPDATE**: said "the police surrounded the Golden Lampstand Church. Patrol wagons guarded the church. Workers smashed the church’s glass. At this point, excavators are digging into the church, but we are not allowed to enter or watch. The village head and the police from the local police station warned all the believers against entering the church. Now, we really have no idea what is going to happen”, the church was then demolished in a controlled explosion)

Nigeria: Yola, Adamawa state

Bishop Stephen Dami Mamza (aged 49, Christian Association of Nigeria [CAN]; **UPDATE**: said in a press conference "It is on record that less than one week ago, no fewer than 20 innocent Christian farmers were killed in separate attacks in and around Tambo. Luru

village in particular saw its worst days when herdsmen wielding sophisticated firearms stormed the area, killing 15 people. Within the period under review, not less than 10 churches were burnt down, and in some instances, worshippers were killed...the secretary to the Adamawa state government has propounded a new firearms narrative which seeks to justify the use of firearms by Fulani in the country. This is dangerous and reprehensible, as the law of the country does not allow any civilian the possession of illegal firearms, whether herdsmen or farmers. CAN wishes to state in unequivocal terms that violent elements are easily emboldened and fueled to terror killings by such reckless and unguarded utterances...On the basis of these, we stand to believe that the ongoing carnage is an attempt to discourage Christianity and to silence Christians from free religious practice. We make bold to reject this attempt and ask the government to stop the unfortunate development. Extremism seems to have taken persecution to a new dimension, with armed herdsmen burning down churches, especially the recent attacks two days ago in Sagal community in Maiha, where four of our churches were burnt to ashes and properties destroyed”)

Pakistan

Christian leaders responded to the abduction, rape, and murder of 7 year old Zainab and to police inaction following her abduction

Bishop Joseph Arshad (**UPDATE:** said the church "condemns the rape and murder of Zainab, a seven-year-old girl...the prevalent mindset cannot be beaten by academic education alone. People should be re-educated about human dignity")

Fr Morris Jalal (**UPDATE:** wrote "the cancer of pedophilia is spreading fast, it is not a new phenomenon. Media has only focused on this evil recently. Easy availability of porn on internet has further aided such mindset. Children attending private tuition of Quran in neighborhood are soft targets. Suffocation in society has created psychos")

Rojar Noor Alam (Caritas program director, said "people in Pakistan are shocked and grieved. Every parent can see their child in the eyes of this child, whose innocence was violated, beyond redemption. Ignoring abuses in madrassas helps produce deranged rapists...I hope one day to see all madrassas in Pakistan transformed into happiness centers, with libraries for children, where dancing, painting, and music are taught. We should let children know that the True God lives here and that God is but unconditional love and happiness”)

Michelle Chaudhry (president of the Cecil & Iris Chaudhry Foundation; **UPDATE**: said she was "beyond horrified...[we must] ensure the safety and protection of our children...accountability is essential, those responsible must be punished in order to prevent such incidents from recurring...We at The CICF stand for a terror-free society, where every child is safe and protected, where childhood is allowed to evolve into progressive adulthood")

Christian leaders reacted to the [January 4, 2018](#) placement of their country on a religious persecution watch list by the U.S. government

Bishop Leo Paul (said "I am not sure if this measure by the U.S. would actually help Pakistani minorities, or if it could create more problems for them")

Nadeem Anthony (attorney, said "Religious minorities of Pakistan are 'with' their country. If Pakistan puts its best and sincere efforts to change this, then we can get our name off this list. The only issue is sincere effort. If we want it, then this would happen. We have seen more than 100 houses of Christians set on fire on a mere accusation, and not a single person is convicted. If that would remain the same, then how can we stop other countries accusing us of human rights violations?")

has been made permanent, said “I worked alongside the prisoners in harmony. When speaking with prisoners, staff members or anyone else, I would never make offensive comments. The Bible exhorts believers to ‘love thy neighbor as thyself’, and to ‘let thy light shine before men’; and so being intentionally offensive would violate these commandments...The whole reason I served at the prison was because of my desire to bring the good news of the gospel to people, regardless of their religion or background. I believe that it has the power to transform the lives of all who believe, and so I would never do anything which may cause an individual to not want to hear the Christian message...The prisoners who attended the Christian courses were of different religions, sexual orientations and ethnic backgrounds. Some of them were violent and held views which strongly opposed mine, yet I never made any judgmental or stereotypical comments to any of them. For 19 years, I served with an exemplary record. I worked alongside the prisoners and other staff members in harmony, recognizing our differences and praying that they would come to faith, but equally respecting their decisions and background. I would have had plenty of opportunities to make offensive comments should I have wanted to, and yet during this time, no complaints were ever made about me”)

Andrea Minichiello Williams (Chief Executive of Christian Concerns; **UPDATE:** later stated "To call this Christian who has served without a blemish for almost 20 years an extremist defies belief. Pastor Song's work with prisoners has been shut down for no good reason, denying prisoners of life-giving ministry. We are considering legal action against Brixton Prison which has acted unlawfully by removing Christian services from prisoners without fair process. We are seeking justice not just for Pastor Song but for the prisoners who want to see him...Christian ministry in prisons has a long history, and its presence is essential for the rehabilitation and transformation of lives. Paul's work has led to many prisoners in Brixton turning their lives around, and so it is shocking that prisoners who are desperate for a new way of life should now be prevented from seeing Paul")

But they started badgering us with questions: ‘Who sent you here? Why are you distributing Bibles?’ They soon slipped into filthy language. We told them that we will move on from here, and requested let there be no fight...They started abusing us in extreme vulgar language. One of them sneaked into the car and picked up the copies of Bibles and threw them out. They started kicking the Bibles. They started tearing the Bibles savagely. They got the cartons we had not even opened yet from the boot of the car, threw them down and started kicking and stamping the copies. We tried to stop them, saying, ‘We will not distribute them here, but please don't tear the Bibles. It's the Holy Word of God,’ but they paid no heed. They also started videotaping")

K J Anandham (retired police sub-inspector, said “The Hindus harassed us and even threatened to beat my wife. We are all retired employees and senior citizens, they did not have courtesy for age. Their language was uncivilized and brutal”)

K J Anandham (retired police sub-inspector, diabetic [as is his wife], as members of the Gideons International were stopped on **January 21, 2018** by Hindu radicals who proceeded to burn their Bibles, a criminal complaint for outraging religious feelings was later filed against them, **UPDATE**: called to the police station along with his wife, held all day, said “Because of the complaint...the police joined hands with Hindu extremists and are after us...We were exhausted, without food and water. On the day of attack, we discussed the matter and decided to pray and forgive the assailants, and to not file any case against them”)

Navneet Chhabra, executive director of Gideons International in India, later said “There have been testimonies where people who have themselves burned the Bibles have invited Christ into their lives,” he added. “There are instances where people have picked up torn papers of Bible from garbage, and their lives were transformed. Whoever has done this act of burning the Bibles, we will pray for them that the Lord wipe away the hatred from their hearts. We belong to the same country and share as much patriotism as they do, then why this animosity? We don’t retaliate, we don’t hold any animosity, and we forgive them. We love them”)

The injured people are in much trouble and many have been moved to other private hospitals in Quetta, Karachi and Multan for better treatment...One of our choir members is still under treatment after her intestines were damaged. The bags they are using to help her digestion cost around 1,500 rupees [US\$14] and have to be changed daily. Another choir member's daily expenses are 4,000 rupees [US\$36] due to a leg fracture")

Jerry Datim (described a series of Fulani Muslim attacks "It was about 12 noon, when some Fulani men laid and ambush around Rafiki, a place well close to the 3rd Army Division Cantonment. They killed three people, before moving on to another village, Jebbu Bassa, where they also killed three people. They also burned down a lot of properties...Political leaders in the state have failed to protect the people from the Fulani attackers because they fear that President Muhammadu Buhari may move against any politician that goes against the Fulani, who are Buhari's kinsmen")

Nigeria: Zanwra village, Jebu-Miango, Plateau state

James Nengwe (aged 60, father, church elder, **shot dead** by Fulani Muslims while a few hundred meters from the military camp to which he was fleeing)

Rev Biri Gado Sunday (described the attack following the funeral of a parishioner murdered the day before “After the burial, when I was in the room, one of my members came and said, ‘Kai, Reverend, see these Fulani.’ So as I came out and went and stood in that place, watching at them down there. In fact, they were in groups. But our people here did not know of their gathering. It was around 2:00 p.m. They started [gathering] around 2 p.m...Then, later on, they started exchanging gunshots, Fulanis and the youth. When it was around 4 – 5 p.m., it got worse. It was getting scary so I had to leave...At about 5:20 p.m., I saw the Fulani chasing these youth in my direction. I even called the youth Chairman, telling him that we need security people. If [we do not receive help], our church may be burned down. He tried to get to the security, but there was no response [from the military checkpoint a mile away or the base five miles away]...approximately 17 houses were burned down, with at least 12 belonging to members, although there could easily be more. [They also] killed three people, a bus driver and two others [who] were just passing, and are not residents of the community...See those ashes, they are my books!”)

Those who destroyed our buildings may have been expecting to silence the voice of Christians, but they have failed. Perhaps by doing so, they wanted to send a strong signal to the Church, that Christians are not wanted”)

Pastor Sabo Batchiri (reported to have said “The Niger of today is no longer tolerant. It has become a country where everyone speaks only of religion. Despair has created hatred in the hearts and drives many to find refuge in religion. These people who preach hate are more dangerous than terrorists. Because terrorism is only an epiphenomenon, the fruit of what has been sown in people’s hearts...It’s sad to notice that three years after the attacks, none of the victims has received any compensation from the government. Though we’ve forgiven, and we as an organization rejected the government’s paltry offer of funds, the right of individuals to receive compensation from the government remains intact...Those victims have lost all their savings and belongings. Personally I’ve lost my church and my house, including my pastoral library containing more than 800 books...If nothing is done, these victims will keep for a long time the trauma of this situation. Still, the victims are filled with a deep sense of injustice, with some saying if some mosques were attacked, or if these victims were Muslims, the treatment would certainly have been different...As it’s

written in the Bible, ‘God has risen beauty from ashes’. It’s a great encouragement for the people of God that the majority of the destroyed churches have been rebuilt. New buildings, more beautiful and more visible, have been erected for the glory of God...These sad events also confirm that Jesus is the Lord and nothing could prevent us from serving him. Our faith has been reinforced. It has also showed that the church is not limited to the buildings, but it’s formed by all of us, the people of God”)

Jacques Kagninde (Esprit Bible College, church destroyed in the [January 17, 2015](#) rioting; **UPDATE:** said “Those who preach hate are well known. The media that broadcasts this speech are also known, but no action is taken to stop them. We are afraid because we are a minority without any defense, and anything can happen to us at any time. Our eyes are turned to God”)

It does not solve the half-century long standoff between house churches and the official Three-Self system. We do not have the strength to bear either more deeply

entrenched 'People's Government at all levels' or greater church-state conflict...As the pastor of a house church, I intend to peacefully reject the legitimacy and execution of these regulations")
