## **Poland**

- Fr Aleksander Ziejewski (aged 68, beaten by robbers in his church sacristy in Szczecin along with two others on July 28, 2019)
- Agata Rejman (midwife, testified that her hospital in Rzeszow performed abortions, as of October 16, 2014 has been threatened with legal action)
- Dr Bogdan Chazan (under government investigation in Warsaw as of June 10, 2014 for refusing to perform an abortion;
  - fined US\$23,000, fine under appeal as of July 7, 2014, given his well-known pro-life activities the case appears to be a sting operation designed to overturn existing abortion restrictions;
  - dismissed from Holy Family hospital in Warsaw on July 10, 2014, said "This decision today is the beginning of the attack on the conscience of doctors and persons holding managerial positions in health care, breaking the consciences of those who follow the rules of natural law, and above all do not agree with killing a man")
- Christina Shabo (aged 25, U.S. resident, said in Krakow on July 29, 2016 that despite the murder of several relatives in Iraq by ISIL she has come to pray that God have mercy on them even though she has not yet forgiven them)
- Archbishop Henryk Hoser (supported Dr Bogdan Chazan, on July 10, 2014 called the actions against him "ethically unacceptable, unjustified, out of proportion, unjust, absurd and legally doubtful")
- Ireneusz Wołoszczuk (attorney and professor, stated on July 7, 2014 that Dr Bogdan Chazan had broken no laws, said the legal attack and fine against him were "scandalous")
- Jacek Kotula (aged 48, pro-life demonstrator, a judge has ruled on October 16, 2014 in a closed session that when he called abortion 'killing' he defamed the Rzeszow hospital that performs the abortions, ordered him to publicly apologize with words chosen by the court and to pay all court fees, the court refused to allow witness testimony and refused to release the legal reasoning for the decision;
  - attended a January 8, 2015 demonstration of 150 persons at the Canadian Embassy in Warsaw to protest the December 24, 2014 arrest and continued detention of Mary Wagner)
- Senator Kazimierz Jaworski (wrote after a judge ruled on October 16, 2014 in a closed session that when pro-life demonstrators called abortion 'killing' they defamed the Rzeszow hospital that performs the abortions, ordered them to publicly apologize with words chosen by the court and to pay all court fees, and the court refused to allow witness testimony and refused to release the legal reasoning for the decision: "We can't say that abortion is killing? This is shocking in itself. But what's more, we are not even allowed to find out why.")
- Cardinal Kazimierz Nycz (on July 10, 2014 called the firing of Dr Bogdan Chazan "a dangerous

- precedent, violating the rights of all people, not just Catholics")
- Marianna Popieluszko (aged 92, described in an article published on May 7, 2013 how she raised her son Bl Jerzy Popieluszko in Okopy, who was murdered by three agents of the SB [the Polish KGB] in 1984)
- Mariusz Dzierzawski (arrested at an August 2, 2012 pro-life demonstration in Kostrzyn for possession of 'obscene' material, **UPDATE**: arresting officers convicted of illegal arrest on February 20, 2015 in Slubice)
- Przemysław Sycz (aged 35, pro-life demonstrator, a judge has ruled on October 16, 2014 in a closed session that when he called abortion 'killing' he defamed the Rzeszow hospital that performs the abortions, ordered him to publicly apologize with words chosen by the court and to pay all court fees, the court refused to allow witness testimony and refused to release the legal reasoning for the decision;
  - attended a January 8, 2015 demonstration of 150 persons at the Canadian Embassy in Warsaw to protest the December 24, 2014 arrest and continued detention of Mary Wagner)
