Russia: Yekaterinburg

The former royal family and their accompanying retainers were executed by the Bolsheviks, all were later declared 'passion bearers' by the Orthodox Church

Tsarina Alexandra Feodorovna Romanova (aged 46, wife of Nicholas Romanov, killed)

Olga Nikolaevna Romanova (aged 22, daughter of Nicholas and Alexandra Romanov, killed)

Tatiana Nikolaevna Romanova (aged 21, daughter of Nicholas and Alexandra Romanov, killed)

Maria Nikolaevna Romanova (aged 19, daughter of Nicholas and Alexandra Romanov, killed)

Anastasia Nikolaevna Romanova (aged 17, daughter of Nicholas and Alexandra Romanov, killed)

Alexei Nikolaevich Romanov (aged 13, son of Nicholas and Alexandra Romanov, killed)

Dr Yevgeny Botkin (aged 53, killed)

Anna Stepanovna Demidova (aged 40, maid, killed)

Alexei Yegorovich Trupp (aged 62, footman, killed)

Ivan Mikhailovich Kharitonov (aged 46, husband, father, cook, killed)

Thursday July 18, 1918



Russia: Alapayevsk

Eight members of the Romanov family and others associated with them were thrown by the Bolsheviks into a mine shaft, grenades and then burning brush was then thrown in after they were heard to be singing hymns from the bottom of the shaft

Sr Elisabeth Feodorovna Romanova (aged 53, widow of assassinated Grand Duke Sergei Alexandrovich Romanov, professed religious sister, killed, autopsy showed she died from effects of the fall, had lived long enough to have bandaged another victim with part of her habit)

Sr Varvara Yakovleva (killed, autopsy showed she died from effects of the fall)
