- Boris Fedorov (aged 29, arrested on March 8, 1924; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 3 years' internal exile, sent to Kargasok, Narym region)
- Dmitry Kryuchkov (aged 37, literary translator, arrested in Petrograd on December 7, 1923; sent to Butyrka Prison in Moscow on December 19, 1923; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment, sent to Irkutsk Prison)
- Elena Fedorova (arrested on March 8, 1924; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 3 years' internal exile, sent to Kargosok, Narym region)
- Fr Johannes Deibner (aged 51, husband of Marie Panet Deibner, father of Fr Alexander Deibner and Ivan Deibner, arrested in Petrograd on November 17, 1923; **UPDATE**: sentenced in Butyrka Prison to 10 years' imprisonment, sent to Suzdal Prison)
- Sr Lucia Chekovskaya (aged 43, arrested in Petrograd on November 18, 1923, charged with leading illegal clubs and with contact with Polish diplomats; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment, sent to Yekaterinburg Prison, later transferred to Tobolsk Prison)
- Sr Maria Komarovskaya OP (aged 25, arrested on November 13, 1923; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 3 years' internal exile, sent to Samarovo, Tobolsk region)
- Fr Nikolay Aleksandrov (aged 40, father of Catherine Aleksandrova, arrested on November 13, 1923; **UPDATE**: sentenced to ten years in prison, sent to the Solovki prison camp in the Solovetsky Islands)

- Sr Raisa Krylevskaya OP (aged 28, arrested on January 30, 1924; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 3 years' internal exile, sent to Tobolsk region)
- Sr Sofia Ivanova OPL (aged 39, arrested on March 8, 1924, held in Butyrka Prison; UPDATE: sentenced to 5 years' internal exile, sent to Siberia, fate unknown)
- Sr Sophia Eismont OP (aged 24, arrested on March 8, 1924; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 3 years' internal exile, sent to Obdorsk, Narym region)
- Viktor Gotovtsev (aged 47, arrested on November 12, 1923, sent to Butyrka Prison; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 8 years' imprisonment, sent to Chelyabinsk Prison, held in solitary confinement)
- Vladimir Balashev OPL (aged 44, engineer, arrested on November 16, 1923; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment)

Russia: Petrograd

- Fr Igor Akulov (aged 27, arrested on November 29, 1923; **UPDATE**: sentenced to ten years' imprisonment)
- Sr Lidia Gildebrandt OSF SVP (aged 35, widow, mother of a young daughter, arrested on January 10, 1924; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment, sent to Kostroma Prison)
- Siergiej Karpinski (former seminarian, arrested in November 1923; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment, sent to Orel Prison)
