Dmitry Kryuchkov (aged 39, literary translator, arrested in Petrograd on December 7, 1923; sent to Butyrka Prison in Moscow on December 19, 1923; sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment on May 19, 1924, sent to Irkutsk Prison; UPDATE: transferred to Aleksandrov Political Isolator, later transferred to Siblag and worked as a miner)

Fr Zygmunt Chmielnicki (aged 34, arrested on espionage charges on November 6, 1923; released for lack of evidence on December 25, 1923; **UPDATE**: arrested, sent to Butyrka Prison in Moscow, Russia)
