Fr Paul Asheberg (aged 32, sent into internal exile in 1925; **UPDATE**: released)

Russia: Butyrka Prison, Moscow

Fr Jan Kotwicki (aged 29, arrested in Zhytomyr, Ukraine on November 4, 1923; released on December 25, 1923; re-arrested on May 9, 1924, hospitalized, later sent to Kharkiv Prison and then to Butyrka Prison; **UPDATE**: released in a prisoner exchange, sent to Poland)

Fr Zygmunt Chmielnicki (aged 35, arrested in Berdychiv, Ukraine in June 1926; **UPDATE**: released)

Russia: Irkutsk

Fr Igor Akulov (aged 30, arrested on November 29, 1923; sentenced to ten years' imprisonment on May 19, 1924; **UPDATE**: released from prison into internal exile in Siberia)

Russia: Kargosok, Narym region

Boris Fedorov (aged 32, arrested in Moscow on March 8, 1924; sentenced on May 19, 1924 to 3 years' internal exile; **UPDATE**: partially released from internal exile, settled in Voronezh, returned to Moscow in 1929)

Elena Fedorova (arrested on March 8, 1924 in Moscow; sentenced to 3 years' internal exile; **UPDATE**: partially released from internal exile, fate unknown)

Russia: Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp

Fr Adolf Fedorowicz (aged 38, arrested in Orel, Belarus in 1925, sentenced to possibly 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; **UPDATE**: arrived, fate unknown)

Stanislaw Kozaczynski (aged 57, husband of Anna Kozaczynska, arrested in 1924, later released; **UPDATE**: arrested, charged with 'conveying disinformation to GPU agents')

Metropolitan Vasyl Kostantynovytch Lypkivsky (aged 63, placed under house arrest)

Ukraine: Skvyra

Maria Kozlowska (aged 23, arrested on July 18, 1921 for an illegal border crossing, later released; **UPDATE**: investigated, not convicted, released but forced to sign an agreement to spy on the church)

Ukraine: Stavishche

Anton Basinski (aged 37, church organist, arrested, sentenced to six months' in prison, suspended)

Fr Peter Awgło (arrested in 1923 in St Petersburg, released; **UPDATE**: arrested on charges of espionage and counter-revolutionary activity, released after six and a half months)

Bishop Rafael Guízar y Valencia (aged 49, went into hiding in 1910, pursued his ministry while disguised as a junk dealer; fled the country in 1915 for the United States after the government issued a 'shoot on sight' order against him, later returned in January 1920 as a bishop; **UPDATE**: fled the country a second time, returned in 1929)
