### **Ukraine: Kiev**

Stepan Deyneko (aged 51, streetcar motorman, arrested on [January 15, 1933](#) on charges of belonging to a Ukrainian military organization; **UPDATE**: sentenced to death)

### **Russia: Moscow**

Fr Igor Akulov (aged 36, sentenced on [May 19, 1924](#) to ten years' imprisonment; released from prison in Irkutsk and into internal exile in Siberia in 1927; **UPDATE**: released from internal exile, returned to Moscow)

### **Russia: Leningrad Prison**

Fr Wincenty Dejnys (aged 53, arrested in [Leningrad](#) on [February 5, 1928](#) on charges of 'teaching religious doctrine to young, under-age children, leading an illegal monastery and collecting funds for aiding convicted priests'; sentenced on [August 13, 1928](#) to 7 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; arrested on [Anzer Island](#) on [July 5, 1932](#) on anti-Soviet charges, said "I am ready to give my life for my Catholic convictions"; **UPDATE**: sentenced to one year solitary confinement, sent to Ladeinos Pole Station camp)

### **Russia: Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp**

Fr Pawel Chomicz (aged 39, arrested in [Leningrad](#) on [December 3, 1926](#), charged with counter-revolutionary activities; sentenced on [June 27, 1927](#) to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; arrived at [Solovetsky](#) on [July 3, 1927](#); transferred to [Anzer Island](#) in [June 1929](#); arrested for illegally saying Mass; **UPDATE**: sentenced to one year in a penalty isolator)

### **Russia: Yaroslavl Prison**

Fr Jozef Krummel (aged 61, arrested in [Starokostyantyniv, Ukraine](#) on [December 19, 1929](#); sentenced to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp on [June 27, 1930](#); **UPDATE**: transferred to Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp)
