Thursday July 6, 1933



### Russia: Krasnoyarsk

Fr Bronislaw Dunin-Wasowicz (aged 35, sentenced in [Ukraine](#) on [January 27, 1927](#) to 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp after having been rearrested; released, sentenced to 3 years' internal exile in [Kirensk, Irkutsk oblast](#) in [1929](#); arrested in [March 1931](#); transferred in [June 1931](#) to solitary confinement in [Irkutsk](#); transferred to [Krasnoyarsk Prison](#) on [February 1, 1932](#) despite his sentence being completed; **UPDATE:** released from prison, sentenced to internal exile in Pirovsk, eastern Siberia)

### Russia: Arkangelsk

Fr Jozef Borodziula (aged 40, arrested [December 29, 1926](#) in [Vitebsk, Belarus](#); sentenced in [March 1927](#) to 3 years' imprisonment a labor camp, sent to [Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp](#); released from the camp in [1930](#), sent into internal exile; **UPDATE:** released from internal exile)

### Russia: Tomsk

Fr Mateusz Brynczak (aged 69, arrested with a group of parishioners in [Belilovka, Ukraine](#) in [1930](#), sentenced to 3 years' internal exile; arrested on [April 25, 1931](#); released in [March](#)

1932 for lack of evidence; arrested on [February 9, 1933](#) on espionage and 'religious propaganda' charges, admitted he had performed baptisms; sentenced on [June 27, 1933](#) to 3 years' internal exile to Eastern Siberia; **UPDATE:** sent in a convoy to Krasnoyarsk Prison for transfer to Kazachinsk, Krasnoyarsk oblast)

**Saturday July 22, 1933**



**Russia: Leningrad prison**

Fr Pawel Chomicz (aged 39, arrested in [Leningrad](#) on [December 3, 1926](#), charged with counter-revolutionary activities; sentenced on [June 27, 1927](#) to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; arrived at [Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp](#) on [July 3, 1927](#); transferred to [Anzer Island](#) in [June 1929](#); arrested for illegally saying Mass on [July 3, 1932](#); sentenced on [May 27, 1933](#) to one year in a penalty isolator; **UPDATE:** arrived)
