Wednesday April 1, 1936



### Russia: Crimea

Anton Enes (aged 60, farmer, lost his farm in Yevpatoria, Crimea in 1934 due to 'backbreaking' taxes, joined a workers' cooperative as a stable hand; **UPDATE**: arrested for being in contact with a priest, sent to Simferopol Prison)

### Russia: Simferopol, Crimea

August Fuchs (aged 52, arrested, possibly convicted, fate unknown)

### Russia: Yevpatoria, Crimea

Martin Haag (aged 51, arrested on March 31, 1936 for having 'close contact with the German pastor Frison'; **UPDATE**: indicted on anti-Soviet agitation and espionage charges, convicted, fate unknown)

Robert Haag (aged 19, arrested for having 'close contact with the German pastor Frison', indicted on anti-Soviet agitation and espionage charges, convicted, fate unknown)

### **Russia: Belbaltlag labor camp**

Fr Wladyslaw Dworzecki (aged 62, arrested on January 26, 1930 in Kamyanets-Podilsky, sent to Kiev, indicted on anti-Soviet and counter-revolutionary charges; sentenced on May 12, 1930 to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; **UPDATE:** granted early release as an invalid, returned to Kamyanets-Podilsky)

**Russia: Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp**

Anna Brilliantova (aged 27, biology student, arrested in [Moscow](#) on [July 27, 1933](#) on charges of plotting to kill Stalin; sentenced on [February 19, 1934](#) to 8 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, married Kerim Kaziyev; **UPDATE:** gave birth to Teimur Kaziyev)

**Thursday April 23, 1936**



**Russia: Belbaltlag labor camp**

Fr Adam Gareis (aged 49, arrested in [Orenburg](#) on [January 21, 1930](#); sentenced on [June 6, 1931](#) to 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, commuted to internal exile; arrested in [Tambov](#) in [December 1934](#); sentenced in [Voronezh](#) on [November 19, 1935](#) to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; **UPDATE:** [possible date of death](#))

**Russia: Simferopol**

Aleksander Antonovich Godzelikh (aged 32, metalworker-machinist, arrested)

**Ukraine: Vinnytsia oblast**

Anastasius Golembiowski (aged 54, arrested on [January 12, 1935](#) on counter-revolutionary charges; **UPDATE:** sentenced to 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp)

Marian Goliszewski (aged 38, church organist, arrested on [March 27, 1935](#) in [Popovtsy](#) on counter-revolutionary charges; **UPDATE:** sentenced to 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, fate unknown)

**Russia: Murom**

Fr Peter Sergeevich Petrikov (aged 33, arrested in [Moscow](#) on [April 14, 1931](#) on counter-revolutionary charges; sentenced on [June 5, 1931](#) to 3 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to [Mariinsky](#); released from the camp on [September 17, 1931](#), moved to [Murom](#); **UPDATE**: arrested on counter-revolutionary charges, interrogated)

**Ukraine: Piatigora, outside Kamianets-Podilskyi**

Fr Jan Brydycki (aged 64, seized by Komsomol youth in [Kamianets-Podilskyi](#) in [1935](#) for his energetic pastoral activity, hung upside down, set on fire, rescued, went into hiding; **UPDATE**: arrested, had been hiding with the Woroniecki family, sent into internal exile, **died** possibly in 1937)

**Germany: Krefeld**

**Thirteen priests and deacons sentenced to prison on currency exchange violations**

Fr Franz Loh SCJ (sentenced in absentia to 8 years' imprisonment, his religious community was fined 500,000 marks)
