Anton Dagus (aged 32, factory heating technician, smuggled religious literature, arrested on [May 8, 1931](#), charged with "keeping anti-Soviet pamphlets"; sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp on [March 7, 1932](#); sentenced to death on [October 14, 1937](#); **UPDATE: shot dead**)

Archpriest Sergy Pokrovsky (aged 57, **shot dead**)

Fr Alexander Dornhof (aged 46, arrested in [Rohleder](#) on [March 12, 1930](#); sentenced on [April 20, 1931](#) to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; sentenced to death in the [Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp](#) on [October 14, 1937](#); **UPDATE: shot dead**)

Fr Aloysius Kappes (aged 52, arrested in [Kharkiv, Ukraine](#) on [July 14, 1930](#) on counter-revolutionary and espionage charges stemming from his fundraising trips abroad for charity; sentenced to death on [April 20, 1931](#), sentence commuted to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to [Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp](#); sentenced to death on [October 14, 1937](#), the camp commander wrote 'from the moment of his arrival in the camp until the present has led energetic counter-revolutionary activity. He has grouped the imprisoned priests around himself. He set up illegal Masses, using them to attach counter-revolutionary elements to himself. He has systematically engaged in malicious counter-revolutionary agitation. He is an open enemy of the Soviet regime'; **UPDATE: shot dead**)

Fr Jozef Karpinski (aged 49, arrested in [Ukraine](#) on [October 26, 1929](#); indicted on [January 27, 1930](#) on anti-Soviet and counter-revolutionary charges; sentenced on [May 12, 1930](#) to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; transferred to [Yaroslavl Prison](#) on [May 26, 1930](#); transferred to [Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp](#) in [October 1930](#); transferred to [Kem](#) in [January 1934](#); sentenced to death on [October 9, 1937](#); **UPDATE: shot dead**)

Fr Piotr Kapusto (aged 46, sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp on [August 23, 1931](#), had been arrested in [Mozyr, Mogilev oblast, Belarus](#) for non-payment of the church tax; sentenced to death on [October 14, 1937](#); **UPDATE: shot dead**)

Fr Shio Batmanishvili (aged 52, arrested on [October 16, 1927](#) in [Tbilisi, Georgia](#); sentenced on [January 16, 1928](#) to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; arrested on espionage and anti-Soviet activities charges on [Anzer Island](#) on [July 5, 1932](#); sentenced to death on [October 14, 1937](#) in [Leningrad](#); **UPDATE: shot dead**)

Fr Adam Bellendir (aged 48, arrested on a train in a border region near Poland; sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; sentenced to death in [October 1937](#); **UPDATE: shot dead**)

Fr Antoni Dziemieszkiewicz (aged 46, arrested in [1929](#); sentenced on [March 13, 1930](#) to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; sentenced to death on [October 9, 1937](#) in [Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp](#); **UPDATE: shot dead**, years later a parishioner recalled “Fr Antoni attracted people with his kindness, intellect, artistic giftedness and eloquence. His homilies were interesting, simple and inspired; they awakened in one the very best sentiments. In addition to his concerns with the church, Fr Antoni always visited the sick and the poor, helping them with whatever he could. In those difficult years of the 1920s, when the food situation was so dire, Fr Antoni sought ways to help the poor: for example, being an artist, he made various statuettes from clay and painted them [all this was done at the expense of his time for rest and sleep]. Several parishioners would then take the statuettes and sell them, and the money thus earned would go to help the poor. He accepted a martyr's death – and why? Because he was a pure soul, because he was devoted to God, to the Church and the people! Blessed be his memory! We, like wandering sheep, were scattered all about and for a long time bore this heavy loss in our hearts”)

Fr Boleslaw Jurewicz (aged 50, arrested in [Leningrad](#) on [August 15, 1929](#); sentenced on [September 13, 1930](#) to 10 years' imprisonment in a concentration camp; arrived at [Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp](#) on [October 6, 1930](#), later transferred to [Anzer Island](#); arrested in [1932](#), charged with 'creation of an anti-Soviet group, carrying out anti-Soviet agitation, secretly celebrating liturgical and religious rites and maintaining an illegal contact with a free worker for purposes of transmitting abroad information of an espionage nature about the situation of Catholics in the USSR'; sentenced to death on [October 9, 1937](#); **UPDATE: shot dead**)

Fr Iosif Dzemian (aged 49, arrested on [June 17, 1930](#) in [Leningrad](#); sentenced on [December 2, 1931](#) to 10 years' imprisonment in prison; sentenced to death on [October 9, 1937](#); **UPDATE: shot dead**)

Fr Jozef Kowalski (aged 39, secretly ordained in [Leningrad](#) on [December 4, 1928](#); arrested in [Fastiv, Ukraine](#) on [May 29, 1929](#); during interrogation in [Kiev](#) on [June 17, 1929](#) said “As a believer, I was dissatisfied with the policy of anti-religious propaganda of the Soviet regime, which forbade the opening of theological seminaries”; sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp on [June 12, 1930](#); transferred from [Yaroslavl Prison](#) to [Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp](#) on [September 27, 1933](#); spent time in the Savvatiev special isolator in [1935](#); placed in the prison block in [September 1937](#); sentenced to death on [October 9, 1937](#); **UPDATE: shot dead**)

Fr Peter Baranowski (aged 55, sentenced on [September 20, 1929](#) to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; arrested on espionage and anti-Soviet activities charges on [July 5, 1932](#) on [Anzer Island](#); sentenced to death on [October 9, 1937](#); **UPDATE: shot dead**)

Fr Stepan Eroian (aged 40, arrested on [November 26, 1929](#) in [Tiflis, Georgia](#); convicted on [August 3, 1930](#), sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a camp; arrived at [Solovetsky Special Purpose Camp](#) on [August 15, 1930](#), later transferred to [Anzer Island](#); arrested in 1932, charged with 'creation of an anti-Soviet group, carrying out anti-Soviet agitation, secretly celebrating liturgical and religious rites and maintaining an illegal contact with a free worker for purposes of transmitting abroad information', placed in solitary confinement; sentenced to death on [October 9, 1937](#); **UPDATE: sentence executed**)
