Germany: Buchenwald concentration camp

Fr Matthias Spanlang (aged 63, Austrian, arrested on May 24, 1938 for anti-Nazi homilies and newspaper articles; refused a conditional release from Dachau concentration camp in

December 1938, later transferred to Buchenwald; **UPDATE**: moved to the punishment bunker after assisting Fr Otto Neuruer baptize a condemned prisoner, died after most likely being hung upside down for days)

Germany: Sachsenhausen concentration camp

Fr Jozef Wojciech Guz (aged 50, arrested by the Soviets in Grodno on March 21, 1940, later escaped, crossed into German occupied Poland and was arrested; transported from Dzialdowo prison in Poland to Sachsenhausen on May 8, 1940; **UPDATE**: drowned by a prison guard, had been unable to march with other prisoners due to multiple fractures)

Czech Republic: Prague

Fr Josef Beran (aged 51, had published the papal encyclical *Mit Brennender Sorge* [With Burning Anxiety] which attacked Nazism on or after March 21, 1937; **UPDATE**: arrested by the Gestapo, sent to Theresienstadt and later Dachau concentration camps)

France: Chambon-sur-Lignon

Pastor Andre Trocme (cousin of Daniel Trocme, said in a homily "Great pagan pressures will be exercised on ourselves and our families, to try to lead us to a passive submission to the totalitarian ideology...The duty of Christians is to oppose violence on their conscience [with] weapons of the spirit. We appeal to all our brothers in Christ that none agree to collaborate with such violence, and in particular, in the coming days, with the violence that will be directed against the English people. Love, forgive, doing good to our opponents, it is the duty. But we must do so without abdication, without servility, without cowardice. We will resist, when our opponents want, require us to submissions contrary to the orders of the Gospel. We do so without fear, as also without pride and without hatred")
