Fr Boleslaw Dzudziewicz (aged 32, arrested by the Soviets on January 11, 1940; **UPDATE**: sentenced as a "socially dangerous element" to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to the Arkhangelsk Promkombinat camp in Bereznyaki)

Russia: Ukhtizhemlag labor camp, Ukhta, Komi ASSR

Fr Stanisław Brawer (aged 54, arrested for counter-revolutionary activities in Polonnoye, Ukraine, sentenced to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp on May 14, 1936; UPDATE: released, died the following year)

Germany: Dachau concentration camp

Fr Johannes Maria Lenz SJ (aged 38, Austrian national, arrested in Vienna on December 5, 1938; acquitted on May 6, 1940; arrested by the Gestapo on May 18, 1940; **UPDATE:** arrived, abused and tortured)

Russia: Adygea ASSR

Olga Fitsner (aged 55, office worker, arrested in Moscow on January 15, 1934; sentenced on February 12, 1934 to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; released from Bamlag labor camp on December 2, 1937, exiled to Adygea ASSR; arrested on February 20, 1940; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Siblag)

Monday August 19, 1940



Russia: Ukhtpechlag labor camp, Chibiu, Komi ASSR

Fr Jozef Kozinski (aged 51, arrested on August 19, 1935 in Topory, Ruzhin region, Zhytomyr oblast, Ukraine on anti-Soviet and counter-revolutionary charges; sentenced on May 14, 1936 to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Ukhtpechlag; UPDATE: released, returned to Topory, denied the freedom to serve as a priest, worked on a collective farm, later taken to a German concentration camp, liberated by the Soviet Army, allowed to resume his ministry in 1953)

Fr Juliusz Kaczorowski (aged 31, sentenced to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Vorkutlag, had been arrested earlier in the year)

Chiune Sugihara (aged 40, convert, Japanese diplomat, against his orders on July 18, 1940 began to issue visas that allowed 10,000 Jews entry to Japan; **UPDATE**: had to stop issuing

visas to Jews due to the closure of the consulate, illegally turned over his consulate seals to local Jesuits so that visa production could continue)

Fr Vladislaw Adamski (aged 51, arrested on August 26, 1940 in Ludzisko, Poland, sent to Szczeglin transit camp; **UPDATE**: transferred to Sachsenhausen concentration camp)
