Germany: Dachau concentration camp

Fr Andreas Rieser (aged 31, Austrian national, arrested in Dorfgastein on June 23, 1938; arrived at Dachau on August 3, 1938, once was forced to make and wear a crown of barbed wire, Jewish inmates were then forced to strike and spit on him; transferred to Buchenwald on September 27, 1939; UPDATE: transferred to Dachau, survived a death march at the end of the war, suffered from the effects of his imprisonment for the rest of his life)

Fr Vladislaw Adamski (aged 51, Polish citizen arrested on August 26, 1940 in Ludzisko, Poland, sent to Szczeglin transit camp; transferred on August 29, 1940 to Sachsenhausen; **UPDATE**: transferred to Dachau concentration camp)

Fr Pawel Prabucki (aged 47, Polish citizen, brother of Fr Alojzy Prabucki and Fr Boleslaw Prabucki, arrested in Gostkowo, Poland in the autumn of 1939, sent to Sachsenhausen; **UPDATE**: transferred to Dachau concentration camp)

Thursday December 19, 1940



Germany: Berlin

Pastor Heinrich Gruber (married, father of three, organized the hiding of Jews among his parishioners during Kristallnacht on November 9, 1938; discovered the February 13, 1940 deportation of 1,200 German Jews to Poland, convinced Prussian State Minister Hermann Goring to temporarily stop the deportations, later threatened with arrest by the Gestapo; **UPDATE:** arrested by the Gestapo for attempting to travel to occupied France to visit more deported German Jews)

Germany: Brandenburg an der Havel

Lothar Ernst Paul Kreyssig (aged 42, district court judge, member of the Confessing Church, reported to the Minister of Justice on July 8, 1940 that he suspected that mentally disabled adults and children under the jurisdiction of his court were being murdered in an euthanasia campaign, later issued an injunction prohibiting the movement of his charges

to the euthanasia centers, and filed a charge of murder against Philipp Bouhler, a top aide to Adolph Hitler; summoned to the Justice Ministry in Berlin on November 13, 1940, after being shown the T4 euthanasia program authorization that had been signed by Adolph Hitler said "The Fuhrer's word does not create a right", was then told "If you cannot recognize the will of the Fuhrer as a source of law, then you cannot remain a judge"; **UPDATE**: suspended from the judiciary)
