**France: Paris** 

Fr Joseph Benedict Stoffels SCJ (aged 46, Luxembourgian citizen, arrested by the Gestapo for aiding refugees, sent to Buchenwald concentration camp)

Fr Nicholas Anthony Wampach SCJ (aged 31, Luxembourgian citizen, arrested by the Gestapo for aiding refugees, sent to Buchenwald concentration camp)

## Saturday March 8, 1941



### Lithuania: Kretinga

Fr Antanas Dirvele OFM (aged 40, arrested in 1940 on an illegal border crossing charge after the Soviet invasion; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 8 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Pechorlag, Komi ASSR, escaped, fate unknown, the KGB ended its manhunt in 1960)

#### Sunday March 9, 1941



#### Lithuania: Vishnyeva

Fr Julian Cimaszkiewicz (aged 51, arrested in Moscow, Russia on June 23, 1927 on charges of 'anti-Soviet agitation and teaching religion to under-age children and minors'; sentenced on November 18, 1927 to 8 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Solovetsky

Special Purpose Camp; transferred to Butyrka Prison in Moscow in 1928, released in a prisoner exchange, sent to Poland; **UPDATE**: arrested by the Soviets)

## Saturday March 15, 1941



### **Poland - now Ukraine: Ternopil**

Fr Adam Gromadowski (aged 29, arrested by the Soviets in Podvolochisk in the spring of 1940 on charges of distributing illegal literature; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Berdychiv Prison)

### Ukraine: Khiniche, Volodymyr

Fr Wladyslaw Czyzewski (aged 30, arrested, sent to Lviv Prison, sentenced to death, commuted to 25 years' imprisonment in a camp)

# Germany: Dusseldorf prison

Fr Franz Loh SCJ (sentenced in absentia in April 1936 to 8 years' imprisonment, his religious community was fined 500,000 marks; arrested in Luxembourg on December 10, 1940; **UPDATE**: died from diabetes in the prison infirmary)

## Monday March 24, 1941



**Ukraine: Kirovsk** 

Fr Czeslaw Kaniak (aged 49, sentenced to death on November 29, 1940, had been arrested earlier in 1940; **UPDATE**: shot dead)

#### Germany

Dietrich Bonhoeffer (aged 35, banned from public speaking in September 1940 by the RSHA under Himmler due to 'subversive activities', ordered to regularly report to the Gestapo; **UPDATE**: banned from publishing after having published a book defending the Jewish roots of Christianity)

### **Germany: Gellenbeck**

Fr Gustav Gorsmann (arrested for calling French prisoners "My brethren" and for posting a card at his rectory door which read "Gruss Gott" - "May God greet you" - rather than "Heil Hitler")

## **Germany: Ochtrup**

Fr Hermann Scheipers (aged 27, arrested in October 1940 for ministering to Polish slave laborers; **UPDATE**: sent to Dachau concentration camp)
