Tuesday June 3, 1941



Romania - now Ukraine: Izmail

Fr Johannes Hondru (aged 64, arrested by the Soviets on July 10, 1940; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 8 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, fate unknown)

Germany: Dachau concentration camp

Fr Engelmar Unzeitig CMM (aged 30, arrested by the Gestapo in Glokelburg, Austria on April 21, 1941 for homilies that supported Jews and encouraged parishioners to resist Nazi propaganda; **UPDATE**: sent to Dachau without trial)

Friday June 13, 1941



USSR

Fr Stefan Kiwinski (aged 39, Polish citizen, arrested in 1940, sent to a POW camp in Polonde, outside Wilkowishiai; UPDATE: transferred to the Kozelsk POW camp in Russia, and later to the Gryazovets POW camp)

Saturday June 14, 1941



Lithuania: Kaunas

Prof Pranas Dovydaitis (aged 54, Catholic writer and youth leader, arrested by the Soviets, sent to Starobelsk POW Camp, then Sverdlovsk Prison, then the Gariyskoye sector of Sevurallag labor camp, interrogated)

Lithuania: Vilnius

Fr Stanislaw Czapiewski SJ (aged 30, arrested by the NKVD, later sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Sevurallag labor camp, Sverdlovsk oblast, Russia, at the end of the year was amnestied to join the Polish Armed Forces of the East)

Fr Jan Cibor (aged 43, arrested by the Soviets Soviets in Turka, outside Stryi, Poland on December 4, 1939; transferred to Starobelsk in 1940; **UPDATE**: transferred to Sevvostoklag labor camp, Magadan oblast)

Fr Dorde [George] Bogic (aged 30, abducted by three Ustasas, tied to a tree, tortured, maimed, and blinded, shot dead)

Fr Josef Zotz (aged 39, arrested on July 3, 1940 for speaking against anti-Semitism in his homilies and for aiding Wehrmacht deserters; **UPDATE**: released from prison)

Fr Stanislaw Eliasz (aged 37, arrested by the Soviets, sent to Berezovtsy prison and later to Minsk prison where he was killed prior to the end of June 1941 during the Soviet retreat)

Monday June 23, 1941



Russia: Chusovoy, Perm Krai

Fr Walter Ciszek SJ (aged 37. U.S. citizen, arrested, with two other Jesuits had taken advantage of the 1939 Soviet occupation of eastern Poland to volunteer as workers for transfer to Siberia for underground missionary work, charged with anti-Soviet activities and espionage, transferred to Lubyanka Prison in Moscow, beaten and tortured, forced to sign confessions)

Ukraine

Fr Wladyslaw Bukowinski (aged 37, arrested by the Soviets on August 22, 1940, later sentenced to 8 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; **UPDATE**: "miraculously" spared during the liquidation of his prison during the Soviet army retreat when he was not hit by the bullets, gave absolution to his dying fellow prisoners, returned to Lutsk)

Germany: Freising prison

Fr Korbinian Aigner (aged 56, arrested in Hohenbercha on November 22, 1939 for a homily on "Thou shalt not kill" in which he said the recent failed assassination of Hitler might have saved a million people, sent to Freising prison; sentenced on May 7, 1940 to seven months' imprisonment; **UPDATE**: sent to Dachau)

Tuesday June 24, 1941



Poland: Knyszyn

Fr Edward Jung (aged 29, arrested by the Soviets in the autumn of 1939, soon released; **UPDATE**: killed during the retreat of the Soviet army)

Poland - now Ukraine: Lutsk Prison

Fr Bronislaw Galicki (aged 57, arrested by the Soviets in Volodymyr-Volynskyi in the spring of 1940 on 'participation in Polish conspiratorial activity' charges, sentenced to death; **UPDATE**: executed during the Soviet Army retreat)

Fr Jozef Kazimierz Czurko (aged 33, arrested by the Soviets in Volodymyr-Volynskyi in the spring of 1940 on 'participation in Polish conspiratorial activity' charges, sentenced to death; **UPDATE**: shot dead during the Soviet Army retreat)

Fr Anton Roman Balut (aged 42, arrested in Lviv in 1940; **UPDATE**: sentenced to death as 'an enemy of the people')

Ukraine: Lviv Prison

Fr Kazimierz Konopka SJ (aged 62, shot dead by the retreating Soviet Army)

Ukraine: Kiev

Fr Boleslaw Charczuk (aged 28, previously arrested in Soviet-occupied Poland, sentenced to death as an 'enemy of the people' during a period of military activity for having given spiritual guidance to Polish Home Army soldiers and shot dead)

Ukraine: Stradch

Fr Nicholas Konrad (aged 67, husband of Antonia, father of four, shot dead by Checkists while returning home after visiting a sick parishioner)

Volodymyr Pryjma (aged 34, father of three, church cantor, shot dead by Checkists while returning home after visiting a sick parishioner)

Antonia Konrad (widow of Fr Nicholas Konrad, later emigrated to the United States)

Fr Wincent Jach (aged 44, arrested in Ptich, Belarus in 1940; **UPDATE**: shot with other prisoners during the retreat of the Soviet Army, thrown onto a pile of corpses, survived, fate thereafter unknown)

Ukraine: Antonovka, outside Zvenyhorodka

Fr Leon Chudy (aged 35, arrested by the retreating Soviet Army while traveling to visit the sick, shot dead)

Ukraine: Berdychiv Prison

Fr Adam Gromadowski (aged 29, arrested by the Soviets in Podvolochisk in the spring of 1940 on charges of distributing illegal literature; sentenced in Ternopil on March 15, 1941 to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; **UPDATE**: 'miraculously' escaped execution when the prison was liquidated during the Soviet Army retreat)

Ukraine: Kiev

Fr Wiktor Kwapinski (aged 57, arrested earlier in 1941 in Lviv, survived the mass shootings in Kiev Prison following the German invasion, returned to Lviv and resumed his ministry)

Fr Wladyslaw Lanocha OP (arrested by the Soviets in 1940; **UPDATE**: sent to a camp, fate unknown)

Fr Friedrich Karas (aged 45, Austrian, arrested)

Germany: Dusseldorf-Derendorf prison

Martin Gauger (aged 35, attorney, resigned from the judicial service in Monchengladbach on August 25, 1934 to avoid the loyalty oath to Adolph Hitler; swam the Rhine river into the

Netherlands on May 9, 1940 to escape military service, Germany invaded the Netherlands the following day; arrested in the Netherlands on May 19, 1940, attempted to escape but was shot, returned to Germany; **UPDATE**: transferred to Buchenwald)
