Friday December 5, 1941



Germany: Dachau Concentration Camp

Fr Heinrich Konig (aged 42, arrested on September 30, 1941 in Gelsenkirchen; UPDATE: arrived)

Fr Aloysius H Schmitt (aged 32, naval chaplain, drowned while helping sailors escape from the capsized USS Oklahoma)

Japan

Fr Pedro Arrupe SJ (aged 34, Spanish citizen, arrested on suspicion of espionage, later released)

Japan: Kyoto

Fr Patrick James Byrne MM (aged 53, U.S. citizen, placed under house arrest, not imprisoned thanks to his popularity)

Japan: Nagasaki

Dr Paul Takashi Nagai (aged 33, convert, husband of Marina Nagai Midori, father of Makoto aged 6, radiologist, shaken by a presentment that Nagasaki would be destroyed in the war)

Japan: Tokyo

John A Hewitt (aged 34, missionary, British citizen, detained in October 1941, interrogated for 5 days, released; **UPDATE**: detained, later refused to be exchanged to Britain with diplomats and other missionaries)

R G Wright (missionary, British citizen, detained in October 1941, interrogated for 5 days, released; **UPDATE**: detained, later exchanged to Britain with diplomats and other missionaries)

Russia: Gryazovets, Vologda oblast

Fr Andrzej Busiuk (aged 33, military chaplain, arrested by the Soviets in Suwałki, Poland between September 17 and October 12, 1939, sent to a POW camp; UPDATE: amnestied, joined the Polish Armed Forces in the East as a military chaplain)

Bosnia: Pale

Five nuns were abducted by Chetnik soldiers, convent burned, forced to march through waist-deep snow

Germany: Wurzburg

Fr Joseph Georg Simon Hafner OCDS (aged 41, banned in 1938 from teaching religious education in Oberschwarzach due to his anti-Nazi views; arrested in August 1941 for asking a Nazi on his deathbed to acknowledge that his second civil marriage was invalid; **UPDATE:** sent to Dachau Concentration Camp)

Saturday December 13, 1941



Poland: Auschwitz Concentration Camp

Fr Konrad Saweda (administered last rites to Fr Ludwik Bartosik)

Fr Ludwik Bartosik OFM Conv (aged 32, arrested by the Germans on September 19, 1939; rearrested on February 17, 1941 in Niepokalanow monastery, Teresin by the Gestapo; transferred from Piwiak Prison in Warsaw to Auschwitz on April 4, 1941; **UPDATE:** died after a series of injuries, infections, and strokes)

Fr Robert John Cairns MM (aged 57, U.S. citizen, taken by Japanese naval personnel, presumed dead)

Four nuns reportedly jumped from a second story window to avoid rape by Chetnik soldiers, possibly bayoneted to death

Joseph Eberle Jr (aged 25, son of Joseph Eberle, sent with his mother into internal exile after the 1930 arrest of his father in Krasny Kut, Saratov oblast, worked as a metalworker;

UPDATE: arrested)

Wednesday December 31, 1941



Russia: Ust-vymlag, Komi ASSR

Fr Boleslaw Dzudziewicz (aged 33, arrested by the Soviets in Drahichyn on January 11, 1940; sentenced as a "socially dangerous element" to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp on August 6, 1940; escaped from Arkhangelsk Promkombinat camp in Bereznyaki on

October 21, 1940, recaptured, sentence increased to 10 years'; **UPDATE**: amnestied to join the Polish Armed Forces of the East as a chaplain)
