Tuesday September 1, 1942



Russia: Leningrad

Anna Ignatowicz (aged 53, arrested on July 13, 1942 on anti-Soviet charges including '"organizing an underground church, where secret worship services were held'; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, fate unknown)

Jadwiga Kazakowa (arrested on July 13, 1942 on anti-Soviet charges including "organizing an underground church, where secret worship services were held'; **UPDATE**: sentenced to possibly 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, fate unknown)

Klementina Kalygina OSF (aged 54, milliner, arrested on November 26, 1929; sentenced on September 8, 1930 to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, later sent into internal exile and then returned illegally to Leningrad to pursue active ministry; arrested on July 17, 1942, charged with 'organizing an underground church where secret worship services were held and damaging, anti-Soviet agitation was conducted'; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, fate unknown)

Maria Koszko OSF (aged 65, arrested on July 13, 1942 on anti-Soviet charges including "organizing an underground church, where secret worship services were held'; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, fate unknown)

Czech Republic: Kobylisy, Prague

Bishop Gorazd aka Matej Pavlík (arrested on June 27, 1942 after he attempted to deflect blame for harboring the assassins of Reinhard Heydrich from others to himself, tortured; **UPDATE**: executed by firing squad along with the other priests and staff of the cathedral)

Jan Sonnevend (church council chairman, executed by firing squad)

Fr Vaclav Cikl (husband of Marie Ciklova, executed by firing squad)

Pastor Marc Boegner (aged 61, in a pastoral meeting pleaded with more than 60 pastor to rescue Jews, the pastors and their associates would later save thousands of Jews, had earlier ignored calls for his prosecution by the anti-Semitic French media)

Tuesday September 15, 1942

Fr Gustav Gorsmann (arrested in Gellenbeck in March 1941 for calling French prisoners "My brethren" and for posting a card at his rectory door which read "Gruss Gott" - "May God greet you" - rather than "Heil Hitler"; transferred to Dachau on October 3, 1941; UPDATE: died)

Tuesday September 22, 1942



France: Vichy

Pastor Marc Boegner (aged 61, ignored calls for his prosecution by the anti-Semitic French media; **UPDATE**: met with Prime Minister Pierre Laval, demanded that he stop the roundup and deportation of Jewish children, Laval refused)

Wednesday September 23, 1942



Russia: Moscow

Archimandrite Fabian Abrantowicz MIC (aged 58, detained by Soviet border guards on October 22, 1939; tortured in Lviv prison, indicted for espionage on November 13, 1939; charged with "fighting against the revolutionary movement and making an illegal border crossing" on August 15, 1942; UPDATE: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp)

Fr Walter Ciszek SJ (aged 38. U.S. citizen, arrested in Chusovoy, Perm Krai on June 23, 1941, with two other Jesuits had taken advantage of the 1939 Soviet occupation of eastern Poland to volunteer as workers for transfer to Siberia for underground missionary work, charged with anti-Soviet activities and espionage, transferred to Lubyanka Prison in Moscow, beaten and tortured, forced to sign confessions,; indicted on August 26, 1942; UPDATE: sentenced on September 23, 1942 to 15 years' imprisonment at hard labor, kept at Butyrka Prison, 'broken', signed incriminating statements)
