Events – April 1943

Friday April 2, 1943



Bulgaria: Sofia

Metropolitan Stefan aka Stoyan Popgueorguiev (successfully confronted King Boris concerning the pending deportation of 8,000 Jews to Germany in early March 1943, had threatened to open churches and monasteries to shelter Jews if the order was not rescinded; **UPDATE**: called a synod which again condemned the laws "restricting and persecuting the Jewish minority in our country...Our people...cannot tolerate injustice, cruelty, and violence against anybody")

Germany: Berlin

Pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer (aged 37, fiancé of Maria von Wedemeyer, co-founder of the Confessing Church, **UPDATE**: arrested)

Maria von Wedemeyer (fiancée of Pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer for three months)

Germany: Munich

Josef Muller (aged 45, husband of Maria, father of Christa, attorney, arrested by the Gestapo in Munich on February 9, 1934, interrogated by Heinrich Himmler, refused an offer to join the SS, said "I am philosophically opposed to you. I am a practicing Catholic, and my brother is a Catholic priest. Where could I find the possibility of a compromise there?", released by Himmler due to grudging respect after he told Himmler that he had advised the previous Barvarian government to arrest and shoot Himmler during the March 9,

1933 Nazi takeover of Bavaria; **UPDATE**: arrested by the army for his involvement as a courier between the German anti-Nazi resistance and the Vatican)

Fr Richard Henkes (aged 43, German citizen, arrested by the Gestapo on a charge of "sedition of the nation from the pulpit" for his anti-Nazi homilies)

Rev Clifford John Cohu (aged 59. husband of Harriet, arrested on March 12, 1943 for disseminating war news ['anti-German propaganda'] including in his homilies; **UPDATE**: convicted, sentenced to 18 months' imprisonment)

Fr Hubertus Antonius Maria Mol (aged 29, Dutch citizen, arrested on October 7, 1942 in Halsteren, the Netherlands for aiding people in hiding and banned youth groups, **UPDATE**: shot dead)

Germany: Zossen, Berlin

Sgt Francois de Beaulieu (radio operator, court martialed for having copied and disseminated Pope Pius XII's 1942 Christmas radio message, spared the death penalty, sentenced to prison for spreading a "subversive and demoralizing document" and for being "sympathetic toward Jews")

Poland - now Ukraine: Zagaitsy village, Kremenets district, Ternopil province Eleven monks were killed by the German SS in reprisal for guerrilla activity

Germany: Munich

Alexander Schmorell (aged 25, medical student, White Rose resistance leader, arrested on February 24, 1943 after a failed attempt to flee to Switzerland; **UPDATE**: convicted of treason, sentenced to death)

Dr Kurt Huber (aged 49, husband of Clara, father of Brigit and Wolfie, professor of theodicy, White Rose resistance leader, arrested on February 27, 1943; **UPDATE**: convicted of treason, sentenced to death, had said to the court "My actions and aims will be justified by the inexorable course of history. On that I rely with rocklike confidence. I have acted as I had to act, prompted by a voice that came from within")

Traute Lafrenz (aged 23, White Rose resistance member, arrested on March 15, 1943; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 1 year imprisonment, re-arrested upon release, survived the war)

Willi Graf (aged 22, medical student, White Rose resistance leader, arrested on February 18, 1943; **UPDATE**: convicted of treason, sentenced to death)
