Events – April 1944

Monday April 3, 1944



Italy: Monte Cassino monastery

Br Carlomanno Pellagalli (survived the February 15, 1944 bombing of the monastery, later returned to the monastery, supported by German soldiers, possibly suffered from post-traumatic stress; **UPDATE**: likely died)

Italy: Monte Tilia, Leonessa

Fr Concezio Chiaretti (aged 26, Italian military chaplain, U.S. national, executed along with 22 others by the German SS in reprisal for partisan attacks)



Austria: Mauthausen concentration camp

Fr Johann Gruber (aged 54, killed, had bribed guards to operate an underground food distribution operation that helped starving inmates)

Friday April 14, 1944



Estonia – now Russia: Pskov-Caves Monastery, Pechory

Bishop Macarius aka Cosmas Vasilyevich Vasiliev (aged 73, arrested in Leningrad in 1924 for concealing church valuables, sentenced to 5 years' imprisonment, returned after 3 and a half years; arrested on February 18, 1932; sentenced on March 22, 1932 to three years' internal exile, sent to Alma-Ata [now Almaty in Kazakhstan], returned; left for Central Asia in 1937 to avoid arrest, later returned; **UPDATE**: killed in a Soviet bombing raid)

Germany: Brandenberg-Gorden prison

Fr Max Josef Metzger (aged 57, arrested by the Gestapo on June 29, 1943 for writing a letter to a Swedish archbishop concerning post-Nazi Germany; **UPDATE:** executed)

Germany: Gross Rosen concentration camp

Fr Zygmunt Chmielnicki (aged 52, arrested by the Gestapo in Lutsk, Poland in 1943; **UPDATE**: died after severe beatings)

Wednesday April 19, 1944



Germany: Zella-Mehlis, Thuringia

Marcel Callo (aged 22, printer, fiancé of Marguerite Derniaux, conscripted into forced labor in Rennes, France on March 19, 1943, told by Marguerite that he would die a martyr, replied "I could never deserve such an honor"; **UPDATE**: arrested by the Gestapo for being "too much of a Catholic")

Germany: Brandenburg-Gorden Prison

Fr Josef Kirchhoff OFM (aged 51, executed for making 'critical remarks')

Thursday April 27, 1944



France: Paris

Fr Jean Joseph Rosay (aged 42, arrested in Douvaine, France on February 11, 1944 for aiding Jews and shot-down Allied flight crews, implicated himself to save others; **UPDATE:** deported to Auschwitz Concentration Camp in Poland, described by a fellow inmate as 'radiant' and as always helping fellow inmates)

Friday April 28, 1944



USSR: on the road between Vilnius, Lithuania, and Riga, Latvia

Metropolitan Sergii Voskresensky (aged 47, shot dead along with his driver and a friend by assassins wearing German army uniforms, assassins may have been Soviet partisans under NKVD orders)

Hungary: Budapest

Jane Haining (aged 47, missionary, British citizen, deported to Auschwitz, had been arrested by the Gestapo earlier in the month on charges of having 'worked among the Jews' and 'weeping when putting yellow stars on the girls', had refused to leave her orphanage in 1940 when ordered by her church)

China: Xuchang, Henan province

Fr Giovanni Botton CFX (aged 35, Italian citizen, died from bayonet and gunshot wounds inflicted by Japanese soldiers during his surrender, his last words included "I offer my life to the Lord for the salvation of China")

Jerzy Zachuta (seminarian, arrested by the Germans, shot dead)

Daniel Trocme (aged 34, French citizen, cousin of Pastor Andre Trocme, arrested in Le Chambon-sur-Lignon, France for sheltering several Jews; **UPDATE**: killed)

Teresio Olivelli (aged 28, Italian citizen, war veteran, law professor, arrested by the Germans for writing Christian and anti-Nazi literature)
