Tuesday August 1, 1944 Beginning of the Warsaw Uprising

Wednesday August 2, 1944



Poland: Warsaw

German Waffen-SS soldiers kill approximately 40 Poles in the cellar of a Jesuit monastery including refugees, 16 non-clergy employees, 8 priests and 8 brothers

Fr Bruno Pawelczyk SJ (survived the massacre because he was in another part of the city, later captured, forced into a burial unit that sealed the monastery cellar)

Fr Edward Kosibowicz SJ (Father Superior, taken to Mokotow Field for questioning, shot dead)

Fr Franciszek Szymaniak SJ (returned to the monastery after the massacre, shot dead)

Fr Wladyslaw Wiacek SJ (killed)

Zbyszek Mikolajczyk (aged 10, altar server, killed)

Jakob Kastelic (aged 47, attorney, husband, arrested on July 23, 1940 for anti-Nazi activities; sentenced to death for treason on March 1, 1944; **UPDATE**: hanged)

Joop Westerweel (aged 45, husband of Wilhelmina, teacher, arrested on March 10, 1944 after helping Jewish children escape to Spain, tortured; **UPDATE**: executed)

Nikolaus Gross (trade unionist, arrested in connection with the assassination plot on Hitler)

Germany: Beuron

Eugen Bolz (aged 62, attorney, Interior Minister, spent several weeks in a concentration camp in 1933, released; **UPDATE:** arrested for having agreed to serve in a post-Nazi government)

Germany: Brandenburg an der Havel

Fr Alois Grimm SJ (aged 57, Austrian, arrested in October 1943 for religious instructions he had given to SS officers, both of whom testified against him; **UPDATE:** sentenced to death, later wrote "The hour has come, I am going home into eternity. In a few hours, I will stand in front of my Judge, my Redeemer and my Father. It is God's will, to be done everywhere. Don't mourn over me, I am returning home, you have to wait. I give my life for the kingdom of God, which knows no end, for the Society of Jesus, for the youth and religion of our home land")

Hans-Bernd August Gustav von Haeften (aged 38, jurist, arrested on July 23, 1944 for involvement in the July 20th plot to assassinate Hitler; **UPDATE**: convicted, sentenced to death despite having objected to the assassination of Hitler on religious grounds, called Hitler "A great perpetrator of evil", hanged)

Fr Feliks Kasperowicz (aged 49, arrested in Dzyarzhynsk, Belarus on January 28, 1934; sentenced on February 26, 1934 to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Karlag in Kazakhstan; transferred in September 1936 to Ukhtpechlag in Russia; transferred to Vorkutlag on June 11, 1938; UPDATE: released, sent into internal exile to Arkhangelsk oblast)
