USSR

Fr Czeslaw Łapinski (aged 54, arrested, sent to a camp or into internal exile) https://biographies.library.nd.edu/catalog/biography-1083



Russia: Butyrka Prison, Moscow

Fr Walter Ciszek SJ (aged 41. U.S. citizen, arrested in Chusovoy, Perm Krai on June 23, 1941, with two other Jesuits had taken advantage of the 1939 Soviet occupation of eastern Poland to volunteer as workers for transfer to Siberia for underground missionary work, charged with anti-Soviet activities and espionage, transferred to Lubyanka Prison in Moscow, beaten and tortured, forced to sign confessions,; indicted on August 26, 1942; sentenced on September 23, 1942 to 15 years' imprisonment at hard labor, kept at Butyrka Prison, 'broken', signed incriminating statements; **UPDATE**: exiled to the Urals, worked as a dump truck river, engaged in underground missionary work)

Russia: Norillag labor camp, Dudinka, Taymyr Dolgano-Nenets Autonomous Okrug

Fr Jozef Janczurewicz (arrested in Poland in the autumn of 1939 by the Soviets; **UPDATE**: known to have been in Norillag after 1945, fate unknown)

Fr Kasper Koniuszewski (arrested in Poland in the 1939-1941 timeframe by the Soviets, sentenced to a labor camp; **UPDATE**: known to have been in Norillag, fate unknown)

Russia: Rostov-on-the-Don

Fr Jozef Kandefer OFM Cap (arrested in Sendishove in 1944, sentenced to possibly 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; **UPDATE**: transferred to a camp near Rostov)

Russia: Siberia

Fr Vladislav Akola-Kulak (aged 55, farmer in Rechki, Vitebsk province, Belarus, arrested on October 11, 1930 during the collectivization campaign; sentenced to five years' exile in Siberia on January 26, 1931; UPDATE: arrested for illegally saying Mass, sentenced to ten years' imprisonment)

Egypt: Old Cairo

Fr Mina el-Baramousy aka Azer Youssef Atta (aged 43, the future Pope Kyrillos VI, beaten in a murder attempt in his hermitage by bandits, likely in 1939, hospitalized; evicted from his hermitage on October 28, 1941 by the government; **UPDATE**: returned to his hermitage mid-year, evicted by the British after a few months)

Ukraine

Fr Jan Cegielski (arrested and sent to a labor camp)

Ukraine: Lutsk

Fr Karol Galezowski (aged 66, secretly fled from Belarus to Poland in 1926 after threats from the GPU; **UPDATE**: arrested)

Ukraine: Lviv

Fr Jan Dlugosz SJ (aged 44, arrested on counter-revolutionary charges)

Janina Kajtanowicz (investigated, possibly convicted, fate unknown)

Fr Wiktor Kwapinski (aged 62, arrested early in 1941 in Lviv, survived the mass shootings in Kiev Prison in June 1941 following the German invasion, returned to Lviv and resumed his ministry; **UPDATE**: arrested)

Ukraine: Ternopil

Fr Adolf Iwancow (aged 35, arrested)

Fr Vasyl Velychkovsky (aged 42, arrested, sentenced to death, sentence commuted to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp)

Ukraine: Zhytomyr

Fr Roman Jankowski (aged 57, arrested in Kotelnia on counter-revolutionary charges on August 27, 1935; sentenced on August 14, 1936 to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent into internal exile following his release; **UPDATE**: returned from internal exile and resumed his ministry, soon forced to live in Yablonna)
