Bishop Vilmos Apor (aged 53, uncle of Fr Hans Urs von Balthasar and Sandor Palffy, shot on March 30, 1945 while successfully protecting women from rape by Soviet soldiers;

UPDATE: died from his gunshot wounds)

Fr Alois Rabensteiner O.Cist (aged 70, killed by Soviet troops either while protecting women from rape or for moving dead German soldiers' bodies so they would not be run over by tanks [accounts vary])

Fr Alois Kremar OSA (aged 37, killed while protecting women from rape)

Germany: Buchenwald concentration camp

Pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer (aged 39, fiancé of Maria von Wedemeyer; **UPDATE**: transferred to Flossenburg concentration camp)

Josef Muller (aged 47, husband of Maria, father of Christa, attorney, interrogated by the SS in November 1944, told that he was a dead man, replied that death was just a passage to eternal life, when asked if he prayed he replied yes, including for the SS and all his enemies; **UPDATE**: transferred to Flossenburg)

Fr Josef Albinger (aged 33, arrested in Hanaun am Main on November 8, 1941 for circulating a copy of Bishop von Galen's anti-euthanasia homilies, jailed in Frankfurt; arrived at Dachau on February 5, 1942; **UPDATE**: released)

Germany: Nordhausen concentration camp

Fr Daniel Bonnin (aged 38, French citizen, killed)

Peter Goelles (released from prison before the Soviet advance, escaped the subsequent massacre of released prisoners)

Flavio Corra (aged 28, brother of Gedeone Corra, arrested by fascists near Salizzole, Italy on November 22, 1944; transferred to German SS control on December 1, 1944; sent to Flossenburg on January 18, 1945; **UPDATE**: died)

Sr Maria Margareta Kruckl (aged 26, killed while resisting rape)

Pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer (aged 39; fiancé of Maria von Wedemeyer, co-founder of the Confessing Church, arrested on April 5, 1943; **UPDATE**: taken for 'trial' at Flossenburg concentration camp, told a fellow inmate "This is the end — for me the beginning of life")

Monday April 9, 1945



Germany: Flossenburg concentration camp

Pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer (aged 39; fiancé of Maria von Wedemeyer, co-founder of the Confessing Church, arrested on April 5, 1943; taken for trial on April 8, 1945, told a fellow inmate "This is the end — for me the beginning of life"; **UPDATE**: hanged)

Josef Muller (aged 47, husband of Maria, father of Christa, attorney, interrogated by the SS in November 1944, told that he was a dead man, replied that death was just a passage to eternal life, when asked if he prayed he replied yes, including for the SS and all his enemies; **UPDATE**: taken to be hanged, execution stopped due to the intervention of Hitler's chief bodyguard, who was an old friend)

Fr Johannes Wilhelm Pieller OFM (aged 53, arrested on August 23, 1943 for anti-Nazi activities; **UPDATE**: executed by firing squad, the Soviet army was only 6 kilometers away)

Fr Titus Helde SDS (aged 39, killed while protecting women from rape)

Germany: Neuruppin, Ostprignitz-Ruppin

Frantisek Munk (aged 49, husband of Gizela Kohnove Munk, father of Tomas Dezider Munk and Juraj Munk, arrested in Ruzomberok, Slovakia on December 15, 1944 by the Gestapo

due to his Jewish ancestry; **UPDATE**: shot dead during a death march from Sachsenhausen Concentration Camp while protecting his son)

Tomas Dezider Munk SJ (aged 21, son of Frantisek and Gizela Kohnove Munk, brother of Juraj Monk. novice; **UPDATE**: shot dead during a death march from Sachsenhausen Concentration Camp due to illness)

Wednesday April 26, 1945



Germany: Dachau Concentration Camp

Fr Korbinian Aigner (aged 59, arrested in Hohenbercha on November 22, 1939; sent to Dachau on June 23, 1941; **UPDATE**: left Dachau in a death march)

Fr Wilhelm Schamoni (aged 40, arrested in Bad Oeynhausen on December 30, 1939 for homilies based on the papal encyclical *Mit Brennender Sorge* [*With Burning Anxiety*] which called the Nazis barbarians; **UPDATE**: forced out of the camp and into a death march, later escaped)

Fr Korbinian Aigner (aged 59, arrested in Hohenbercha on November 22, 1939; sent to Dachau on June 23, 1941; left Dachau in a death march on April 26, 1945; **UPDATE**: escaped from the death march)

Germany: Dachau concentration camp

Camp liberated by the U.S. Army

- Fr Johannes Burkhart (arrived in Dachau on February 2, 1942; interrogated in September 1943 for attempting to send illegal letters; **UPDATE**: freed)
- Fr Johannes Maria Lenz SJ (aged 43, Austrian national, arrested in Vienna on December 5, 1938; acquitted on May 6, 1940; arrested by the Gestapo on May 18, 1940; arrived at Dachau on August 9, 1940, abused and tortured; **UPDATE:** freed, later wrote *Christ in Dachau*)
- Fr Paolo Liggeri (aged 33, arrested in Milan, Italy on March 26, 1944 for assisting Jews and families of imprisoned or missing soldiers, sent in succession to San Vittore Prison, Fossoli and Bolzano concentration camps, Mauthausen and Gusen concentration camps in Austria, and Dachau concentration camp in Germany; **UPDATE**: freed)

Bishop Jozsef Mindszenty (aged 53, arrested in Veszprem on November 27, 1944 for opposition to government seizure of church property to quarter troops; **UPDATE**: released from house arrest)

Austria: Nickelsdorf, Neusiedl am See

Fr Josef Weber (killed)

Germany: Bergen-Belsen Concentration Camp

Fr Jean Joseph Rosay (aged 43, arrested in Douvaine, France on February 11, 1944 for aiding Jews and shot-down Allied flight crews, implicated himself to save others; deported to Auschwitz Concentration Camp on April 27, 1944, described by a fellow inmate as 'radiant' and as always helping fellow inmates; evacuated from Auschwitz in December 1944; **UPDATE**: died of exposure and exhaustion sometime between April 10-15, 1945)

Germany: Berlin

Pastor Heinrich Gruber (married, father of three, arrested by the Gestapo on December 19, 1940 for attempting to travel to occupied France to visit more deported German Jews; released on June 23, 1943; UPDATE: organized the hiding of women to protect them from rape)

Germany: Munster

Bishop Clemens August Graf von Galen (aged 60, **UPDATE**: complained on or about April 12, 1945 to the British occupation authorities that churches had been desecrated and girls raped)

Germany: Ravensbruck Concentration Camp

Maria Borgato (aged 46, Italian citizen, killed toward the end of April 1945)
