USSR

Archmandrite Ioann Krestiankin (aged 40, imprisoned)

Fr Jan Goj (aged 52, arrested in Rohatyn, Poland [now Ukraine] on October 22, 1939 by the Soviets for a sermon, spent three years in prisons in Slonim, Baranovichy and Minsk; sent to a camp in 1942; **UPDATE**: died, date and location unknown)

Kazakhstan: Karaganda oblast

Fr Karol Galezowski (aged 67, arrested in 1945; sentenced in Lutsk, Ukraine on May 6, 1946 to 8 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; released from imprisonment at Karlag on May 21, 1946 but denied the right to leave; **UPDATE**: possibly died, exact date unknown)



Russia: Bulayevo, outside Tomsk

Fr Feliks Kasperowicz (aged 55, arrested in Dzyarzhynsk, Belarus on January 28, 1934; sentenced on February 26, 1934 to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Karlag in Kazakhstan; transferred in September 1936 to Ukhtpechlag in Russia; transferred to Vorkutlag on June 11, 1938; released on August 22, 1944, sent into internal exile to Arkhangelsk oblast; released from internal exile on February 13, 1947, returned to Dzyarzhynsk, later arrested and sentenced to 3 years' internal exile in Siberia; UPDATE: died, exact date unknown)

Russia: Moscow

Izabella Efimova (arrested, sentenced to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, possibly sent to Karlag labor camp, Akmolinsk sector, Kazakstan)

Russia: Taishet

Adele Dirsyte (aged 41, teacher, former Caritas director, helped hide Jews during the German occupation, arrested on March 6, 1944 in Vilnius, Lithuania for hiding an escapee from the Soviets; sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment on November 11, 1946; sent to a labor camp at Chuma in the summer of 1947; transferred to a labor camp at Taishet in the summer of 1949; **UPDATE**: transferred to a labor camp at Kolyma in the winter of 1950, then to a camp at Magadan in the summer of 1950, organized prayer and religious meetings, wrote the *Prayer Book of Girls Exiled in Siberia*, repeatedly beaten and tortured for smuggling the Eucharist to fellow inmates, lost all her teeth)

Belarus: near Vileyka

Fr Feliks Karpinski (aged 39, arrested in Baruny, Belarus on November 11, 1944 by the Soviets; sentenced on August 16, 1946 in Vileyka to 5 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; arrived at Vorkutlag on September 26, 1947; released on November 10, 1949, returned to Belarus; UPDATE: arrested, sent to Vorkutlag)

Romania: Caldarusani

Bishop Valeriu Traian Frentiu (aged 75, arrested in Oradea on October 28, 1948, sent to a camp in Dragoslavele; transferred to Caldarusani in or after February 1949; **UPDATE**: sent to Sighet Prison)
