Events – April 1950

Tuesday April 4, 1950



Czechoslovakia

Trial begun on March 31, 1950 on charges of treason and espionage; UPDATE: all found guilty and sentenced to 9 years to life imprisonment

Fr Adolf Kajpr SJ (aged 47, arrested in 1941 by the Nazis, held in Terezin, Mauthausen and Dachau concentration camps; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 12 years' imprisonment)

Fr Augustin Machalka CCOP CCOP (aged 43, had spent three years' in German concentration camps, arrested in early 1950; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 25 years imprisonment)

Fr Bohumil Vít Tajovsky CCOP (aged 38, arrested in January 1950; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 20 years' imprisonment)

Fr Frantisek Silhan SJ (aged 45, arrested March 18, 1950; UPDATE: sentenced to 25 years' imprisonment)

Fr Frantisek Mikulasek SJ (aged 35, arrested March 1950; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 9 years' imprisonment)

Fr Ivan Mastiliak CSSR (aged 38; **UPDATE**: sentenced to life imprisonment)

Fr Jan Blesik CSSR (aged 40, arrested March 1950; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 15 years' imprisonment)

Fr Jan Evangelista Urban OFM (aged 49; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 14 years' imprisonment)

Fr Josef Braito OP (aged 51, arrested March 16, 1950; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 15 years' imprisonment)

Fr Jozef Gajliewicz (aged 57, arrested on nationalist activities charges on September 10, 1949; **UPDATE**: sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp)

Russia: Construction Site 859, Chelyabinsk oblast

Fr Wladysław Bukowinski (aged 46; arrested by the Soviets in Lutsk on January 3, 1945; sentenced in Kiev on May 9, 1945 to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; **UPDATE**: transferred to Steplag labor camp in Dzhezkazgan, Karaganda oblast)

Czechoslovakia: Leopoldov, Hlohovec

Fr Metod Dominik Trcka CSSR (aged 63, arrested, later sentenced to 12 years' imprisonment)

Czechoslovakia: Frystak

Fr Ignac Stuchly (aged 79, ejected from his residence by the StB secret police despite being bedridden from a stroke, placed in a retirement home under house arrest, died in 1953)

John Chrysostom Korec SJ (aged 26, seminarian, arrested and sent to a camp, later released, secretly ordained a priest six months later and a bishop less than a year after that, worked as a laborer)

Czechoslovakia: Presov

Bishop Pavel Peter Gojdic OSBM (aged 62, issued a pastoral letter from Presov on January 25, 1939 concerning the government's "Program for the Solution of the Jewish Question" and predicted disaster should it be implemented; accused by the government on October 26, 1942 of protecting Jews by engaging in fictitious conversions; **UPDATE**: arrested for refusing to merge his church into the Russian Orthodox Church)

Auxiliary Bishop Basil Hopko (aged 46, arrested)

Russia: Stalinsk oblast

Fr Dionizy Kajetanowicz (aged 72, arrested in Lviv, Ukraine on November 27, 1945 after refusing to join the Orthodox church; sentenced on March 9, 1946 to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Stalinsk oblast; **UPDATE**: transferred to Minlag)
