Bishop Patrick James Byrne MM (aged 62, U.S. citizen, arrested by North Korean forces in Seoul, South Korea on July 2, 1950, forced to march to Pyongyang, North Korea; UPDATE: after a trial forced to march to the Yalu without food or shelter, said to his fellow prisoners "The greatest privilege of my life, after the gift of the priesthood, is to have suffered for Christ with all of you")

Bishop Patrick James Byrne MM (aged 62, U.S. citizen, arrested by North Korean forces in Seoul, South Korea on July 2, 1950, forced to march to Pyongyang, North Korea; after a trial forced to march to the Yalu without food or shelter, said to his fellow prisoners on November 24, 1950 "The greatest privilege of my life, after the gift of the priesthood, is to have suffered for Christ with all of you"; **UPDATE**: died of pneumonia)

Fr William Booth MM (aged 51, U.S. citizen, arrested by North Korean forces in Seoul, South Korea on July 2, 1950, forced to march to Pyongyang, North Korea; after a trial forced to march to the Yalu without food or shelter; **UPDATE**: absolved Bishop Byrne before his death)

Fr Thomas F Quinlan SSCME (Irish national, arrested by North Korean forces in Seoul, South Korea on July 2, 1950, forced to march to Pyongyang, North Korea; after a trial forced to march to the Yalu without food or shelter; **UPDATE**: buried Bishop Byrne)
