Saturday February 13, 1954



Kazakhstan: Steplag labor camp, Dzhezkazgan, Karaganda oblast

Fr Anton Kuyava (aged 46, arrested in Jazno, Belarus on February 17, 1949, accused of anti-Soviet activities, tortured with sleep deprivation; sentenced in Dzisna, Belarus to 25 years' imprisonment in a labor camp on May 21, 1949; sent to Steplag on July 25 1949, arrived seriously ill; began to show signs of active tuberculosis in March 1952; sentenced to solitary confinement for not wearing camp clothes on or about March 7, 1953 - most likely to identify himself as a priest; **UPDATE**: sentenced to solitary confinement for 3 months for participating in a work slowdown)
