Tuesday April 12, 1955



Russia: Minlag labor camp, Inta village, Kozhvinsk region, Komi ASSR

Fr Adolf Kukuruzinski (aged 61, arrested in Kamianets-Podilskyi, Ukraine on December 28, 1944; sentenced on December 18, 1946 to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; arrived at Minlag on October 14, 1947; **UPDATE**: released, returned to Belarus and later emigrated to Poland)

Czechoslovakia

Sr Zdenka Cecília Schelingova SCSC (aged 38, hospital radiology technician, helped Fr Stefan Kostial escape from the hospital in Bratislava on February 19, 1952 by drugging a guard; arrested on February 29, 1952 for attempting to help priests and seminarians escape custody, tortured, right breast torn apart from continual kicks; sentenced to 12 years' imprisonment by judge Paul Korbuly on June 17, 1952; developed breast cancer in 1954, mastectomy performed in Prague without anesthesia; **UPDATE:** released from prison)

Monday April 25, 1955



Russia: Rechlag labor camp, Vorkuta, Komi ASSR

Fr Pietro Leoni SJ (aged 46, Italian citizen, arrested on April 29, 1945 in Odessa, Ukraine; transferred to Lefortovo Prison in Moscow on July 13, 1945; indicted on anti-Soviet agitation charges on September 13, 1945; sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp on November 12, 1945; transferred to Butyrka Prison on November 24, 1945; transferred to Temlag on December 12, 1945; arrested on June 15, 1947 on false charges of preparing an armed uprising in the camp; sentenced to 25 years' imprisonment in a labor camp on August 29, 1947; transferred to Dubravlag on September 8, 1947; transferred to Rechlag on October 8, 1948; broke his collarbone in December 1948, hospitalized, later put into solitary for 'open incitement of convicts against the Soviet regime'; UPDATE: sentence reduced to seven years under pressure from the Italian government, soon released)

Russia: Vorkutlag labor camp

Fr Jozef Gorodenski (aged 45, arrested on August 20, 1948 in Kobryn, Belarus; sentenced in Brest Prison on September 13, 1948 to 25 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; arrived at Vorkutlag on December 8, 1948; **UPDATE**: granted an early release, returned to Kobryn and resumed his ministry)

Russia: Yaroslavl Prison

Fr Zygmunt Galuniewicz (aged 66, sentenced in Lviv, Ukraine on June 18, 1946 to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; **UPDATE**: released, returned to Lviv and resumed his ministry)
