Tuesday September 6, 1955



Turkey: Istanbul

The Septemvriana, a government instigated two day pogrom which killed at least 37 Christians, severely wounded 32, and resulted in 200-2,000 rapes of men and women and several forced circumcisions - an Armenian priest died from circumcision, and destroyed or damaged 5,317 properties, the government organizers were arrested in 1960, tried, and executed

Alexandros Iatropoulos (teacher, beaten to death)

Asemenia Parantonopoulos (raped, died)

Avakoum Ipekci (died from fright)

Avraam Anavas (killed in a store)

Fr Chrysanthos Mantas (aged 90, burned to death, body thrown down a well)

Despoina Isaakidou (aged 8, threatened with rape along with her mother, rescued by a neighbor, 2 year old brother was so traumatized he had to live with an aunt)

Emmanuel Tzanetes (killed)

Br Euangelos Mastorakes (novice, beaten, hospitalized)

Eve Yolma (aged 16, dragged from the Working Girl's Hostel, raped, murdered)

Metropolitan Gennadios (beaten, later died of his injuries)

George (aged about 65, died of fright)

George Erpapzoglu (church sexton, killed when his church was dynamited)

George Korpovas (killed)

Bishop Gerasimos (beaten, hospitalized, later died of his injuries)

Giannes Balkes (found dead on a street)

Ioannes Poulopoulos (Greek citizen, beaten, stripped, robbed)

Isaak Uludag (educator, burned alive in his school)

Konstatinos Chatzopoulos (father of Member of Parliament Alexandros Chatzopoulos, beaten in his home, died soon after, wife also killed)

Koutsou (widow, gang raped in the street, left out all night groaning and bleeding, hospitalized, went insane)

Nikolas Karamanoglu (killed)

Olga Kimiadou (beaten to death)

Fr Sokrates Papanikolas (severely beaten)

Thanases Misiroglou (killed in his store)

Theopoula Papadoppulou (raped, murdered)

Zenovia Charitonides (raped, died)

Russia: Vorkuta

Fr Michal Drabik (aged 41, arrested in Sambor, Ukraine on January 12, 1945; sentenced on July 17, 1947 in Drohobych, Ukraine to 8 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; released from Vorkutlag labor camp on January 12, 1953 but denied the right to leave - effectively sentenced to internal exile, settled in Vorkuta; UPDATE: released from internal exile, emigrated to Poland)

Fr Adam Czubek (aged 69, sentenced to 25 years' imprisonment in a labor camp on October 10, 1950; **UPDATE**: released)

Wednesday September 28, 1955



Russia: Khabarovsk

Adele Dirsyte (aged 46, teacher, former Caritas director, helped hide Jews during the German occupation, arrested on March 6, 1944 in Vilnius, Lithuania for hiding an escapee from the Soviets; sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment on November 11, 1946; sent to a labor camp at Chuma in the summer of 1947; transferred to a labor camp at Taishet in the summer of 1949; transferred to a labor camp at Kolyma in the winter of 1950, then to a camp at Magadan in the summer of 1950, organized prayer and religious meetings, wrote the *Prayer Book of Girls Exiled in Siberia*, repeatedly beaten and tortured for smuggling the Eucharist to fellow inmates, lost all her teeth; taken to an unknown location in autumn 1953; returned in April 1954 "mentally broken", had been extensively tortured, transferred in the end of 1954 to the section of the camp hospital for the mentally ill, refused to eat food for the 'benefit' of other inmates; **UPDATE**: died)

Fr Stanislaw Dziadek (aged 63, arrested in Drohobych, Ukraine on July 22, 1950; sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp followed by 5 years' internal exile; **UPDATE**: released from a camp)
