Russia: Minlag labor camp, Komi ASSR

Fr Jozef Gajliewicz (aged 63, arrested on nationalist activities charges in Daugavpils, Latvia on September 10, 1949; sentenced on April 8, 1950 to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp; **UPDATE**: transferred to Dubravlag labor camp in the Mordovian ASSR, released soon thereafter, returned to Latvia and resumed his ministry)

Ecuador: 'Palm Beach', Curaray River

Five U.S. missionaries killed by Huaorani tribesmen

Nathanael 'Nate' Saint (aged 32, pilot, husband of Marjorie Farris Saint, father of Kathy, Steve, and Philip, brother of Rachel Saint, killed)

Peter 'Pete' Sillence Fleming (aged 27, husband of Olive Ainslie Fleming, killed)

Philip James 'Jim' Elliot (aged 28, husband of Elisabeth Howard Elliot, father of Valerie Elliot, killed)

Roger Youderian (aged 31, husband of Barbara Orton Youderian, father of Beth and Jerry Lee, killed)

Theophilus 'Ed' McCully (aged 28, husband of Marilou Hobolth McCully, father of Steve, Mike and Matt, killed)

Rachel Saint (aged 42, sister of Nate Saint, later became a missionary to the Huaorani tribe)

Elisabeth Howard Elliot (aged 29, widow of Jim Elliot, later became a missionary to the Huaorani tribe)

Kathy Saint (later lived with her aunt Rachel and was baptized in the Curaray River by two of her father's killers after their conversion)

Steve Saint (aged 4, later lived with his aunt Rachel and was baptized in the Curaray River by two of his father's killers after their conversion)
