Russia: Norilsk, Krasnoyarsk Krai

Fr Walter Ciszek SJ (aged 52. U.S. citizen, arrested in Chusovoy, Perm Krai on June 23, 1941, with two other Jesuits had taken advantage of the 1939 Soviet occupation of eastern Poland to volunteer as workers for transfer to Siberia for underground missionary work, charged with anti-Soviet activities and espionage, transferred to Lubyanka Prison in Moscow, beaten and tortured, forced to sign confessions,; indicted on August 26, 1942; sentenced on September 23, 1942 to 15 years' imprisonment at hard labor, kept at Butyrka Prison, 'broken', signed incriminating statements; exiled in 1945 to the Urals, worked as a dump truck river, engaged in underground missionary work; arrested in 1946 for his underground missionary work, sentenced to 10 years' imprisonment in a labor camp, sent to Norillag labor camp near Dudinka, Taymyr Dolgano-Nenets Autonomous Okrug; transferred to Norilsk in February 1947, worked in a brick factory; UPDATE: released from camp, banished to Krasnoyarsk, secretly established mission parishes, transferred to Abakan after the missions were discovered by the KGB, worked as an auto mechanic)

Watchman Nee aka Ni Tuoseng (aged 52, husband of Charity Chang, arrested on April 10, 1952 on charges of bribery, tax evasion, and theft of state property and government economic information but in reality for refusing to join the official Three Self Help church; **UPDATE**: convicted on all charges, sentenced to 15 years imprisonment in a labor camp)
